

CPL. OTELLO BET Cpl. Otello Bet Of Pen Argyl **Killed in Action**

Cpl. Otello "Taylor" Bet, twenty-five year old son of Mrs. Teresa Bet and the late Dominic Bet of 2 Pen Argyl Street, Pen Argyl, was killed in action December 18 in Belgium according to word received last eve-ning from the U. S. War Depart-ment. He was one of two sons of Mrs. Bet in service. T|4 Bet attended Pen Argyl High School where he played football and baseball. Prior to entering the serv-ice he was employed by Attillio Se-gatti, Pen Argyl grocer and meat market operator. He left for service in the Army December 30, 1942. He first went to New Cumberland from which point he was shipped to Camp Gruber, Okla. November 29, 1943, he last visited his home and early in De-cember of that year moved overseas.

The Bet family only yesterday re-ceived a letter from "Taylor" dated. December 14 in Germany. He was a member of St. Eliza-beth Catholic Church of Pen Argyl.
