Cpl. Otello Bet Of Pen Argyl Killed in Action

Cpl. Otello "Taylor" Bet, twenty-five year old son of Mrs. Teresa Bet and the late Dominic Bet of 2 Pen Argyl Street, Pen Argyl, was killed in action December 18 in Belgium according to word received last evening from the U. S. War Department. He was one of two sons of Mrs. Bet in service.

T/4 Bet attended Pen Argyl High School where he played football and baseball. Prior to entering the service he was employed by Attilio Segatti, Pen Argyl grocer and meat market operator.

He left for service in the Army December 30, 1942. He first went to New Cumberland from which point he was shipped to Camp Gruber, Okla. November 29, 1943, he last visited his home and early in December of that year moved overseas. He was attached to an Army Engineers Unit, serving as a cook.

The Bet family only yesterday received a letter from "Taylor" dated December 14 in Germany.

He was a member of St. Elizabeth Catholic Church of Pen Argyl. He was engaged to Miss Marie Vicaria of Bangor.

In addition to his mother, he is survived by a sister, Santina Bet, at home; a brother, Mario Bet of Meyers Crossing, Bangor R. D. 3; and a brother, Pfc. Americo Bet, with the U. S. Army, now stationed in Germany.
