## Ex-Naval Officer Edward G. Ruyak Enters Law School

Ruyak has recently been placed on inactive duty in the Navy after having served three years. He served a year and a half overseas in the Southwest Pacific Theater and participated in the invasions of New Guinea, Philippines and New Britain islands. For the past year and a half Ruyak acted as instructor in Naval Service and Tactics at the Pennsylvania Maritime Academy, Morrisville, Pa. He also coached the basketball team at the Academy and was secretary of the admissions board for the incoming cadets.

The ex-naval officer graduated from Bethlehem High School in 1939 where he participated in sports, becoming captain of the track team in 1939 and winning the Calvin Carter Hess trophy. Ruyak attended Moravian College, transferring to Temple University and graduating from there in May, 1943, with a B. S. degree in Commerce. While at Temple he was active in social and professional clubs. He was president of the Newman Club and social chairman of the Delta Sigma Pi fraternity.

Following his graduation from that institution, Ruyak enlisted and after completing his indoctrination course at the University of Notre Dame Midshipman's School, was commissioned an officer in the USNR. He was separated as a lieutenant junior grade.
