

Cimino, Caesar D.

Local Seaman, In Typhoon, Reported Dead

A recent letter from the War Department confirmed the death of Caesar D. Cimino, S 1/C, son of Pasquale Cimino, 213 Diamond Street, who was aboard one of three ships sunk in a typhoon December 18, 1944, in the South Pacific.

A telegram received in January reported Cimino missing in action in the South Pacific. This was followed by another wire received February 22, stating there was little

hope for his survival as his ship was caught in a South Pacific typhoon.

S 1/C Cimino enlisted in the U. S. Navy September 3, 1942, and completed his boot training at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station. He participated in the battles of Guam and Saipan and many others in the Pacific. He was 21 years of age.

Surviving are his father, four brothers in the armed forces, Pfc. Domenic F., in France; T/Sgt. Joseph W., in the Philippines; Pvt. Carmen D., in Texas, and Seaman Pietro D., with the Merchant Marine at sea, and three sisters.

A memorial mass will be held Wednesday, April 18, in Holy Rosary Church at 9 o'clock. Rev. Joseph Pugliese will be the celebrant.
