A U. S. NINTH AIR FORCE MARAUDER STATION, England—Sergeant Thomas G. Miller, 450 South New Street, Bethlehem, is clerk in the materiel section of a Ninth Air Force Marauder Station in England. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Miller of Bethlehem. Sgt. Miller's work is concerned with obtaining supplies for the airfield and completing arrangements to move men and materiel whenever it is necessary. This work is of vital importance to the bomb group, as a steady flow of materiel is necessary to keep the B-26's flying, as well as maintaining other activities. Before entering the air force in July, 1942, Sgt. Miller worked as velder for the American Car and Foundry of Bethlehem Steel. After receiving his basic training he was assigned to this group commanded by Col. Wilson R. Wood, Chico, Texas. Sgt. Miller attended the McCann School of Business two years, graduating in 1941.
