CONTINGENT SENT TO ARMY SERVICE

Local Draft Board No. 1 Dispatches Men to Two Training Camps.

Twenty-six Bethlehemites, all of whom have been designated privates in the U. S. Army, left Bethlehem today for army camps, all being sent by Local Draft Board No. 1.

The group was divided into two contingents, the first leaving at 7:40 a. m. for Camp George Meade. They included John Catogas, James Bove, George J. Sobetsky, Frank T. Aylwitis, Leo F. Oechele, Robert H. Kennedy, John F. Pors, Paul Helinsky, Martin H. Suto, Francis B. Baran, Joseph F. Meehan, Thomas George, Jacob A. Saemmer, George E. Xander and Fred Zillinsky. The latter, one of three brothers, now in the army, was named acting corporal, and was in charge of the group.

John Griffith, president of the Bethlehem Tobacco Club, presented each of the privates with an appreciable kit.

The second contingent, headed for Camp Cumberland, left at 11:06 a. m. They were Bernard J. Radle, Thomas C. Eckert, Joseph T. Duhig, Steven F. Novasilech, Stephen Kvochak, Herbert Schadler, Jr., Joseph Latso, Joseph F. Soos, Joseph J. Dozpat, Stephen J. Viskovics and Antonio J. Fernandes. This group was in charge of acting corporal Stephen Kvochak.
