Lucille Bloss Bride Today of Ensign Taylor

Bloss and the late Mrs. Bloss, 818 West Broad Street, was married to Ensign William Roberts Taylor, U. S. N. R., son of Mr. and Mrs. John Taylor of 805 Beverly Avenue. The Rev. Byron K. Horne, pastor of Central Moravian Church, performed the ceremony.

The bride, given in marriage by her father, wore a suit of ice-green wool, with darker green hat, and a corsage of white orchids. Mrs. Robert V. Henning of Neponsit, L. I., N. Y., the former Eleanor Bloss, was her sister's maid of honor. She wore a brown suit with brown accessories and a corsage of purple orchids.

William Metton, of Wilmington, Del., was the bridegroom's best man.

The church was attractively decorated with white gladioli and palms. Mrs. William L. Weiss, organist, played the traditional wedding marches and gave a recital before the ceremony.

A small reception for the immediate families followed at Hotel Bethlehem. After a short wedding trip to the seashore, Mrs. Taylor will return to Bethlehem and Ensign Taylor will report in New York City. When he is assigned to his base, Mrs. Taylor will join him.

The bride was graduated from the Moravian Preparatory School in June. The bridegroom prepared at Harrisburg Academy and was graduated from Lehigh University in January.
