For outstanding performance in combat during the seizure of the Japaneseheld Islands of Saipan and Tinian from June 15 to Aug. 1, 1944, valiantly storming the mighty fortifications and blasting the stubborn defenses of the enemy in an undeviating advance over perilously rugged terrain this battalion was awarded the Presidential Unit Citation.
