

Dozzard, Robert Ray

Two brothers, separated by war for a stretch of 18 months, were at home together this week on brief furlough in Bethlehem. They are the sons of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Gozzard, 900 Main Street, Hellertown. The happy reunion of these boys occurred at the home of another brother, Lawrence Gozzard, 638 Alaska Street.

One of the Gozzard boys in service, Robert Gozzard, stationed at Fort Fisher, N. C., became a Sergeant July first. At the same time he received news of his furlough which he spent with his wife, the former Edna Snell, and their young son, Robert Dennis, whom Sgt. Gozzard has not seen since he was a two-day-old baby.

Ray Gozzard became a Petty Officer Third Class just before he arrived in this country after 18 months sea duty. Both boys were students at Liberty and Hellertown High Schools and former employes of the Bethlehem Steel Company.
