Milton C. Stuart, Professor of Mechanical Engineering at Lehigh University, has been granted a leave of absence for duty in the European Theater of Operations, and will enter the service with the rank of field officer.

According to present plans, Professor Stuart will leave the United States by plane for Paris on September 24. From Paris he will proceed to Biarritz, where he has been assigned to the Army University Study Center as Professor of Mechanical Engineering. There are about 4,000 American soldiers studying at the center which offers a number of intensive courses. At Lehigh since September, 1926,

A former instructor at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and the United States Naval Academy, he has also been associated with Cambria Steel Company, the Baldwin Locomotive Works and the American Car and Foundry Company.

A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania with an M. E. degree, Professor Stuart is the author of a number of technical papers and has also written a book on Thermodynamics.
