**Cpl. Paul Silfies,**

**Northampton, Now  
A Nazi Prisoner**

Cpl. Paul Silfies, who was reported missing in action in Holland since September 19, is now a prisoner of the Germans, according to word received from the War Department by his wife, Mrs. Edna Silfies, 435 E. Fourth Street, Northampton.

Included in his overseas service

was participating in the invasion of France, after which he enjoyed a seven-day furlough in England. He was then sent into action, it is believed in Holland, where he was reported missing.

A paratrooper, he entered the service on January 21, 1942. He received his training at Fort Benning, Ga.; Fort Bragg, N. C., and Camp Wheeler, Ga. and has been overseas for the past year and a half.

Prior to his induction into service, Cpl. Silfies was employed by Bethlehem Steel Company.
