### His Third Promotion In Air Force Career

James Lichtenwalner, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Lichtenwalner of Whitaker Street, Hellertown, in a recent letter to his parents apprised them of his promotion to staff sergeant, the third at regular intervals since his entry into the Army Air Forces through enlistment in September of 1941.

Sgt. Lichtenwalner received his basic training in the Army Air Forces at Sheppard Field, after which he was sent to the Wright Airplane Factory at Paterson, N. J., where he took a special course and

was graduated to receive the rank of corporal upon his being assigned to the 73rd Observation Group at Godman Field, Fort Knox, Ky. He transferred later to the 15th Observation Squadron at the same field and then sent to the Embry Riddle School of Aviation at Miami, Fla., in December of 1942. He graduated from that school with good marks and promoted to the rank of sergeant upon return to his squadron.

Mr. and Mrs. Lichtenwalner are the parents of two more sons serving in the armed forces, Pfc. George Lichtenwalner, serving with an armored battalion stationed at Indian-town Gap, and Pvt. Russell Lichtenwalner, with a coast artillery, barrage balloon battalion, at Camp Tyson, Tenn.
