Recipient of these words, Stephen Demetrovics, 448 East 12th Street, Northampton, yesterday received a wire from the War Department that on June 7 his life-long friend, Stephen Sakavics, fell in action in France.

The young paratrooper was born in Northampton where he lived un-til the early twenties when his par-ents decided to move back to Hun-gary. They took Steve along, but the new world, not the old, was his dream and he returned to America in January, 1937, establishing resi-dence in New York. However, throughout the years, he spent all his vacations in Northampton. He enlisted in the armed forces January, 1941. For a few months he served in an infantry division, but last summer he requested trans-fer to the paratroopers. His last in Northampton where he lived un-
