Area Soldiers Get Discharges At Indiantown Gap Center

The Army's Separation Center at Indiantown Gap, Pa., has more than doubled its rate of discharges within the past two weeks, having reached a figure in excess of 1,100 officers and men returned to civilian life for each of the past three days. The return of officers to civilian life has especially speeded up since announcement of the new point system of retirements, and increased gradually until it topped 100 last Monday and Tuesday.
