**Hellertown Soldier
Prepares Medical
Equipment for Pacific**

Medical equipment being shipped to the Pacific is prepared for the long voyage at Honeybourne, Eng., by Pfc. Nick Doncsecz, Hellertown R. D. 1, and other medical technicians.

Certain surgical instruments prepared by Pfc. Doncsecz require considerable time and trouble to prepare for the long journey overseas. A forcep, for example, gets a brisk cleaning in water, then is dipped into carbon tetrachloride solution and dried again. Then a technician, wearing rubber gloves, dips it again into a menthol solution to remove fingerprints. After the forcep is dried it is covered with an oil preservative, then wrapped in aluminum foil and finally hermetically sealed in cellophane.
