**Jackson M. Sigmon
Gets Lieutenancy
With AMG in Germany**

SIXTH ARMY GROUP, Germany—Jackson M. Sigmon, son of Mr. and Mrs. William L. Sigmon, 523 West Third Street, Bethlehem, Pa., has been given a direct commission as a second lieutenant. He was formerly a sergeant in the G-5 Section (Military Government) of Sixth Army Group, commanded by General Jacob L. Devers.

Following a course of training Lt. Sigmon will be assigned to duties in the military government of Germany.

Lt. Sigmon has two bronze stars on his European Theater of Operations ribbon, denoting participation in two major campaigns. In addition to his service in military government, Lt. Sigmon had been with Civil Affairs in England, North Africa and France. He entered active duty October 15, 1942, and prior to his departure for overseas, he was assigned to the Judge Advocate General's Department in the Fifth Service Command at Columbus, Ohio.

Lt. Sigmon is a member of the Pennsylvania and Northampton County bar and holds degrees from the University of Pittsburgh, the Fletcher School of Diplomacy of Harvard University, and the Duke University Law School.
