## Pfc. Hajdinyak Dies in Action In Germany

Pfc. Stephen G. Hajdinyak, son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Hajdinyak, of 627 Ridge Street, was killed in Germany on October 8, according to word received by his parents.

The young soldier, who never had a furlough since entering the Army on February 3, 1942, received his basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga. and trained at Camp Blanding, Fla., and Indiantown Gap before going overseas. He had been overseas 28 months at the time of his death.

St. Joseph's Windish Catholic Church, and was graduated from the parochial school of the church. He also attended Liberty High School and was employed by a local contractor.

He has two brothers in the service, Pfc. Louis in the U. S. Marine Corps, stationed in Hawthorne, Nev.; and Pfc. Charles, U. S. Army stationed at Camp Kilmer, N. J.
