## Staff Sergeant Charles Wernett Reported Missing In Action 1944

Staff Sergeant Charles T. Wernett, of Bethlehem, flight engineer on a B-24 in the Italian area of warfare, has been missing in action since April 25, his wife was informed last evening by the U. S. Department of War.

Sgt. Wernett, who enlisted April 8, 1941, has been in the Italian sector since last December. His wife, the former Margaret Lanscek, of 1633 East Fourth Street, and his mother, Mrs. Clinton Wernett, 1423 Monocacy Street, visited with him for a brief six hours at Palm Beach, Fla., on December 1, just before he was shipped overseas.

Sgt. Wernett, who was employed by Bethlehem Steel Company prior to his enlistment, received his basic training at Bolling Field; his gunner's wings at Tindall Field, Panama City, Fla.; and training in dive bombing at a field near Savannah, Ga. He graduated as flight engineer at Shephard Field, Tex., and received combat training in New Mexico.
