

A War Department telegram informed Mrs. Kathryn Kelemonick that her son, Cpl. Michael D. Kelemonick, was liberated from a German prison camp. He was interned at Stalag 3B, then was transferred to Stalag 2B, from which he was liberated.

Cpl. Kelemonick is the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Kelemonick, 1705 East Fourth Street. A graduate of Bethlehem High School, he was employed by the Payroll Division of Lehigh University prior to his induction June 13, 1942. He went overseas in October, 1942, to England. He was transferred to Africa where he was captured by the Germans, February 17, 1943, at the Casserine Pass, while on an infantry engagement.
