Soldier Hurt In Italy Home On Furlough

Private Sheb M. Shumar, who was wounded in Italy Jan. 30, and who was invalidated to this country, is visiting at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. Shumar, of 419 Webster Street.

The young soldier suffered a broken leg and a knee injury from shrapnel and has lost the hearing of his right ear. He arrived in the United States July 10 and has been a patient at the Stark General Hospital in South Carolina.

He has had three operations, but now gets around well with the aid of a cane. Next Thursday he will go to Atlantic City for further treatment and possibly for discharge. While living here he attended Holy Infancy Church.

Mr. and Mrs. Shumar's other son Peter, arrived in Italy on about the same date that his wounded brother arrived in this country. They received their first letter from him yesterday.
