Kiss' mishap was received by his family July 22 and on the 30th they were informed of his release from the hospital. Sgt. Kiss enlisted in the Army Air Force June 3, 1940 and received his basic training at Oakland, Cal. He was sent to Curtiss Wright Technical Institute at Glenside and was graduated there as a mechanic. He was thereupon transferred to Will Rogers Field, Oklahoma, and from there was sent to High Point, Greensboro, N. C., at which place he was qualified as a gunner. Since he has been overseas he has been in action 33 times. Kiss is a former employe of the Bethlehem Steel Co.
