**NAVAL AIR CADETS TO BE
SWORN IN OVER RADIO**

DEC 5 1942

**About 2000 Will be Inducted in Na-
tionwide Ceremony Monday.**

Naval Aviation Cadet candidates of all sections of the United States including recent enlistees in that branch of the U. S. armed services for this area will be sworn in Monday night by radio.

The simultaneous mass administration of the cadet oath will be in charge of Lieutenant Commander Albert F. Rice, of the U. S. Navy, who will broadcast from New York City. The program, to be broadcast from 7 to 7:15 p. m. p. m., over National Broadcasting Company Blue network facilities will be heard locally through the Allentown station.

More than 2,000 young men have been accepted throughout the United States for cadet training. The ceremony of induction has been scheduled for Monday in commemoration of Pearl Harbor Day, December 7, 1941. Following administration of the oath, Rear Admiral Richard E. Byrd, famous flier and Antarctic explorer, will address the cadets.
