Five Area FEB 11 1946 Veterans Join Regular Army

Announcement was made today by T. Sgt. Willie W. Warren, in charge of the U. S. Army Recruiting Station, Room 201, Post Office Building, that five more young men from the Bethlehem area have been enlisted recently in the regular Army.

Among those who re-enlisted for three years was Staff Sergeant Richard R. Makos, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alex J. Makos, 1213 Stanhope St. "Dick" has lived in Bethlehem all of his life, and prior to his first enlistment in the Army in 1942, he attended the Bethlehem schools, and later worked in Bethlehem Steel Company. He served with the 91st Division in the European theater and has informed local recruiters that he intends making a career out of the Army. He is spending his 90-day re-enlistment furlough at his parent's home.

Sgt. Charles A. Zovko, 29, son of Michael Zovko, 1535 Broadway, also re-enlisted for another three-year hitch. He has had four years previous service with the 29th Infantry and has requested duty in the European theater. He graduated from Bethlehem High School in 1934, and is also spending his re-enlistment furlough at his home.

Marion J. Palluch, 29 West Morton St., this city, enlisted for three years, also in the European theater. His wife, Mrs. Charlotte Palluch, and three children reside at 321 West Morton St. He was formerly with the 35th Infantry and has served almost eight years in the Army.

John C. Melley, 20, son of Mrs. Mollie R. Melley, 506 Broadway, has been assured by local recruiters that he will be able to spend his next three years in the Air Corps. He has already served two and a half years as an armored gunner, and also expects to make the Army his career.

John J. Hubany, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. John P. Hubany, R. F. D. No. 2, Quakertown, who although new in the Army, is by no means a recruit, since he has served one "hitch" in the Navy. His wife, Helen, resides at 66 Princeton Ave., this city.
