In that post he interviewed returnees from overseas services for classification purposes as a part of the Marine rehabilitation program.

Sgt. Stahlnecker is the husband of the former Ethel Boehm, of Hellertown, and a son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Stahlnecker, all residing at 1328 Jefferson Avenue, this city.

A graduate of Muhlenberg College, the new director was formerly associated with the Easton Free Press as sports editor and later with the Globe-Times as a member of the reportorial staff, which post he held when he entered the service.
