Lt. Richard Aldinger Weds Georgia Girl In Alabama Church

Mr. and Mrs. Edgar Harrison, of Columbus, Ga., announce the marriage of their daughter, Eleanor Madelyn, to Lieut. Richard Carl Aldinger, A. U. S., son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph F. Aldinger, of 707 Tenth Avenue, this city.

The marriage took place Saturday, March 17, in the First Methodist Church, Opelika, Ala., with Rev. T. McNeal officiating. The couple are currently in Bethlehem visiting Lieut. Aldinger's parents.

They were attended by Lieut. and Mrs. Robert L. Mitchell. Lieut. Mitchell is assigned with Lieut. Aldinger at the Fourth Service Command Headquarters in Atlanta, Ga.

Mrs. Aldinger is a commercial artist for the Standard Printing Company in Columbus, and formerly attended art school in Chicago.

Prior to being called to active duty in February, 1943, Lieut. Aldinger was in his senior year at Lehigh University. He enlisted in the Army Reserves in December, 1942.

On being activated, Lieut. Aldinger was stationed at Camp Pickett, Va., where he was graduated from Officers' Candidate Prep School. He was then sent to Officers' Candidate School at Camp Barkley, Tex., and received his commission in the Medical Administrative Corps of the Army November 17, 1943.

After serving a six months' tour of duty in the station hospital at Camp Gordon, Ga., Lieut. Aldinger returned to Camp Barkley to study field medicine and surgery. After completing this course, he was assigned to the Fourth Infantry at Fort Benning, Ga., school troops. Later he was transferred to his present assignment in the Fourth Service Command headquarters in Atlanta.

The young couple was entertained at a dinner party at the home of the bridegroom's uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. F. Willard Wolfe, of 2050 Washington Street, Allentown. They will return to Georgia tomorrow morning.
