**Pfc. Joseph Kucsan
Becomes Civilian**

INDIANTOWN GAP, Pa.—Pfc. Joseph Kucsan, 452 Wyandotte St., Bethlehem, returned to civilian life following his processing and honorable discharge at the Indiantown Gap Separation Center. His wife Mary Mae, and three children Joseph III, Barbara Jean, and Marianne, awaited his return.

A member of the 76th "Liberty Bell" Division, Kucsan served in England, France, Belgium, and Luxembourg. He was a member of the 385th Infantry Regiment in this division.

His one year overseas service was rewarded with the Good Conduct medal, ETO ribbon with three battle stars, the American Theatre ribbon and the World War II Victory medal.

Before embarking for overseas service Kucsan received training at Camp Croft, S. C. and Camp McCoy, Wis.

Previous to his induction into the service Kucsan was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Co.
