Lieut. Jackson Sigmon Home on Leave

Lt. Jackson Sigmon, son of Mr. and Mrs. William L. Sigmon, 522 West Third Street, this city, has just returned to this country after serving 21 months in the ETO. The last assignment of Lt. Sigmon was as legal and political intelligence officer at Offenbach, Germany, Military Government Detachment. Sigmon is now on a 45-day temporary duty status at home for rest and recuperation. He is the holder of the Good Conduct Medal, the Victory Medal with a Silver Star, American Defense Ribbon, European Campaign Ribbon with three battle stars and the Arrowhead denoting participated on D-Day in Southern France, the Bronze Star and the French Croix de Guerre.

Sigmon will return to Indiantown Gap, Pa., on January 21, after conferring in Washington with Civil Affairs Division, U. S. Army. Lt. Sigmon is expecting a position in civilian status as a member of the legal commission for U. S. Government in Germany.

Sigmon, a member of the Northampton County and Pennsylvania Bar associations, is a graduate of University of Pittsburgh, Fletcher School of Harvard and Duke Law School.
