Near the end of the year, a large conference for area Future Teachers took place at Lehigh University. A general forum and individual group discussions provided an enjoyable and informative day.








To anyone seriously interested in automobile mechanics, the Auto Shop is a veritable storehouse of information.

In the first year most of the students spend their time in the theory room. We keep notebooks that contain many interesting facts about the automobile. These notebooks are made up of information given to the students by the instructors or one of the seniors.

We start the practical work in the junior year. Students who have cars bring them in and work on them. All kinds of jobs are done. Transmissions are fixed, engines are overhauled, brakes are adjusted, in short everything that is done in a garage, is done in learning the trade.

The senior year is filled with work and responsibilities. Seniors are expected to help the



juniors and rookies. If the instructor thinks a senior is capable of doing a good job in insdustry, he will find a job for the outstanding student. The student is then given the opportunity to finish school by going to night classes three times a week.

DRAFTING SHOP



Drafting is the graphic language used in the industrial world by engineers and designers to express and record the ideas and information necessary for the building of machines and structures.

This language is entirely a graphical one. It must be interpreted by acquiring a visual knowledge of the subject represented. A student's success in drafting will be indicated not alone by his skill in drawing but also by his ability to interpret the impressions of other draftsmen and engineers.

In this study we must first of all become familiar with the technique of expression and an important requirement is the ability to use instruments correctly. The study of lettering, usually the first work taken up in this technical course, is also extremely important.

The Vocational Department of Bethlehem High School offers a choice of three types of drafting: architectural, structural, and mechanical. The men in the architectural drawing shop specialize in the designing and detailing of homes, business public buildings, entertainment centers, and business establishments. In the structural drawing shop the main operation



is the detailing of columns, beams, and trusses used in such places as buildings and bridges. The mechanical draftsmen designers and details such pieces of machinery as gear boxes, bench drills, double-acting air cylinders, and milling machine arbors.

Drafting, while teaching a boy accuracy, neatness, and giving him an understanding of mechanical and structural things, prepares him well to meet life in industry.

ELECTRICAL SHOP

Electricity is a form of energy which is associated with the presence of invisible particles called electrons and protons. In the Vocational Department of Bethlehem High School electricity is taught in three consecutive years.

In the first year one learns the fundamentals of Electricity. This includes simple bell circuits, the fundamentals of house wiring, annunciator circuits, simple series, parallel circuits, and transformer work.

The second year includes the fundamental of house wiring.

This includes advanced series and parallel circuits accompanied by theory. In the second half of the year the most important work taught is Direct-Current motor work. In this work the manual starter, automatic starters, and field rheostats is most widely used.

In the third and final year in electrical shop one learns Alternating-Current motor work and Theory. In the beginning of the year, one receives an Alternating-Current motor which must be completely rebuilt. In the second half of the year, Alternating-Current Theory is the most important subject worked on. At the conclusion of these three years the electrical student is fully prepared and able to adjust himself to almost any electrical job.



PRINT SHOP

Printing is the art of assembling type systematically in order to reproduce on paper or other substances. The principles of this art were known to the ancient Assyrian nations. Printing from blocks and clay tablets was practiced in China as early as 50 B.C., but modern printing dates back to the invention of movable types which took place less than 500 years ago. Printing has advanced from the lithographic and typographic until the most beautiful and artistic productions of printing are now made available at low prices.

The new print shop in the Vocational Department is fully equipped and well planned. The shop is divided into three main departments. They are the composing room, press room, and bindery room. In the composing room the type is set, proofed, corrected and made-up into pages or forms in order to be printed. In the press room forms are locked in chases placed on the press, made ready, checked and printed. The bindery room operations may include: drilling, perforating, sticking, trimming, folding, cutting, collating, and padding.

All these operations are performed under the skilfull guidance of Mr. Hunsinger and our new composing room teacher M. Bucchin.

It was once asked of a great statesman if he would prefer a newspaper or a government. He chose the newspaper. Printing covers everything from a wrapper on a pack of gum to the billboard along the highway,





MACHINE SHOP

The machine shop in the past has been a number of shops making up a machine shop department. This year in our new school we have one large shop with all the facilities and all the students in one central shop, complete with lecture and theory room, locker room, and tool room.

With the advent of automation many more highly skilled machinists will be needed to fill the needs of industry. The training received in machine shop prepares the graduate for integration into machine shop or any of the closely allied trades.

Over the three year training period the machine shop students are trained on lathe, both horizontal and vertical milling machine, boring mill, shaper, surface grinder, tool and cutter



grinder, drill press, power saw, and a large metal band saw as well as bench and forge work. During this training, safety is emphasized at all times, on all machines. Visual education, blueprint reading, drawing, theory-lecture is also an important part of the training.

The instructors in the machine shop are Mr. Herbert Ross, Jr. and Mr. Anthony Caccitore, men who are skilled machinists and have the gifted art of imparting their knowledge to others. These men are not only making fine machinists out of the students, but they are building character, thus insuring real honest-to-goodness American citizens, and boys who will be an asset to the community and country.



WOOD SHOP



Woodworking is an old craft dating back thousands of years. With the introduction of metal tools there came an expansion in the building of articles made from wood.

A skilled cabinet maker must be able to work with power driven machinery and with hand tools. He must be able to identify different kinds of wood, read blueprints, make joints, and be able to install hardware.

Much of the work done in the cabinet making shop is done for the Red Cross, Salvation Army, and various other organizations. To a certain extent the students may also make outside jobs for themselves.

The student does not run any power machinery in his sophomore year. He spends most of his time helping and watching the more experienced boys and their assignments.

In his junior and senior years, a student may run the machinery and take part responsibility on his assigned jobs.

Mr. Detweiler, our able instructor, has turned out a number of good cabinet makers in his many fine years of teaching and is sure to turn out many more.



ELECTRONICS SHOP

Electronics shop, taught by Mr. Edward D. Hartman, is now one of the best equipped shops of its kind in this state. This equipment is very expensive and delicate and must be handled with great care.

Did you every wonder how a radio receiver operates? We students did and now we have a pretty good idea on how a receiver operates. We learned about the different circuits that go together in the composing of a receiver.

The boys in their sophomore year study the electrical theory and learn how to use meters. They also learn how to compute necessary problems that arise in their studies.

In their junior year, they learn about alternating current, magnetism, and the study of the various types of tubes.

In their senior year, they learn how to spot troubles in receivers and how to solve thes problems. The boys also build receivers of their own and perform certain operations on them.

After they are finished with their studies, the graduates should know enough about electrical work to help them in their future life.

VARSITY FOOTBALL

The football team's winning season, under Coach Warren Harris, provided many thrills for the spectators. In the seasons opener the Hurricanes ran all over Blythe Township 62-0 providing a score which ranks sixth among the schools all-time high. While 5,000 fans watched in the rain, the Hurricanes took on Southern Philadelphia, outclassing them 27-12. Allentown Central Catholic came to our Stadium with a large and powerful team only to be sent home with a decisive 47-6 defeat. The victory made the Hurricane-Viking series 9-0. Continuing their winning streak the blue and red eleven routed Milton Hershey 32-0.

The next two weeks the Hurricanes took to the road with both away games resulting in defeats. The Liberty team was shocked by Reading's power as Bethlehem sufferd their first defeat 33-0. The following Friday in Cottingham Stadium in Easton, the undefeated Red Rovers of Easton shaded the Hurricanes 14-7. Recovering slowly from their losing streak, Bethlehem High outscored West Scranton 34-27 as returning to their home field provided a tonic for the Hurricanes. Phillipsburg, in the eighth contest of the season, came from behind to tie Bethlehem 7-7. Bill Chaikowsky ran an impressive 63 yards for the Bethlehem score. Closing their home season, the Hurricanes' solid team effort provided an easy 33-0 decision over Baltimore Polytechnical. The wind-up of the 1955 campaign took place on the Allentown High field Thanksgiving Day. Victory was Bethlehem's as the Red and Blue Hurricanes racked up a 20-6 victory. This was the first victory at Allentown for Bethlehem since 1934. The seasons record was 7 wins, 2 loses, and 1 tie.



Returning lettermen are Doug Ballie, Frank Szvetecz and Bill Pulley and a successful season is anticipated for 1956.







THE MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM and VOCATIONAL ANNEX

With this integration of both departments a new unity was achieved which has already proved beneficial to the entire school.







A few members of the band were: Robert Hippensteal, drummer; the accordian ace, Stanley Gawlik; the sax player, Tom Rocasky, When the band concluded the opening selection, I saw James Swartz and Eddie Morrison, on the stage. My two friends told a few jokes and were chased off the stage by the high wire artists, Louis Cherney, Harvey Diefenderfer and Tom Dobyan. They exhibited a fine act.

The wild animals act was called next. I met the lion tamer, Teddy Rothrock, the smallest tamer the circus ever had. Then I met the circus doctor, Robert Ference, who took care of the cats. He was responsible for feeding the kittens.

The members assembled again, Teddy took his animals through their acts showing no fear toward them. All the animals were sent back to their cages except one tiger. At this moment Tom Donchez began to speak, "Fearless Banuelo will now lead a horse into the cage, and Teddy will attempt to have the tiger sit on the horses back." This act was completed with great care in the cage.

Elovski then told me this part of the show has been extensively advertised and was the hit of the performance.

Tommy then announced the fastest moving part of the performance. The horse show. John Cacciator was the ring master. The midgets went through a few stunts on the horses when "Ducky" (Donald Bergstresser) appeared and stole the show with his shetland pony.

The tight wire act was introduced at this point to add a little comedy to the show. My old friend, John Filo, was so good that often the members of the show watching the act would gasp as he faked a fall. Once when his accomplice, Charles Pulley, did a back flip somersault to be caught by him, Filo hestitated and it seemed as if Pulley would fall, but he still caught his hands somehow.

Now that the story of the big tent has been told I would like to add the Big Top Hall of Fame, a few names of my friends. They have been granted a portion of the big top and are traveling all over the world entertaining the armed forces and important cities near each stop.

The trophy for the greatest star in the circus world had been given to Tom Donchez. Tom had gone to fame with his tight wire artistry. The trophy for the most versatile person held Richard Karvoski's name. Another entitled, "The Most Exciting Act" had the name Thomas Voytko. I was told that his feat was to drive his motorcycle, standing on the seat, around a simulated barrel. I saw Fred DeBellis and Kenneth Bitler listed on a trophy for the greatest riding team.

As I looked on I noticed a trophy painted red with a model of a hot-rod atop it. The title on it was, "The All-American Daredevils." James Gittings, Rodney Haney, and Frank Wunderler were listed. On another call, "The Greatest Clown," was listed Albert Orta's name. My day had been well spent. George was now escorting me to the gate. I thanked him for the fine time he had showed me. At this moment my private chauffeur met us and guided me to the car.

As we drove back to the hotel I stopped to eat at the Greek's Silver Spoon, owned and operated by George Paulos. I then spent that night at the D & R Hotel.

The following morning was a beautiful day. As I had no business planned for the morning I decided to drive back to Harrisburg. As we were leaving Philadelphia I noticed a sign which read, "Richard Chontofalsky, Architectural Designer." Just before reaching Sellersville I saw a high antenna. As we drove closer I noticed a shop at its base displaying a sign "Inhoff and Pichel, radio and T.V. repair."

We stopped for gas at "The Three Ace Station" owned and operated by Bill Magan, owner; Alton Paulus, body man; and Reds Mumbaurer, mechanic. After the tank was filled, we started on our way again.

We got on the Super Dream Highway and before I knew it I was back at my home in Harrisburg ready to prepare for the afternoon business of keeping Pennsylvania the Keystone State.


In conclusion we have prospered financially through the sale of Christmas cards for the benefit of our social and graduation activities.
