Local Soldier Taught Cooking In Germany

Billeted with his buddies in a German home on the east bank of the Rhine, Sgt. Peter De Angelis is learning not only the techniques of war but the art of cookery as well.

Recently elevated to the rank of sergeant with the Third Army, the young Bethlehemite in a letter home relayed the news of his promotion and the fact that he baked a cherry pie and reproduced one of his mother's favorite dinner dishes, a mixture of fried onions, sausage and scrambled eggs. He also received from his family 20 letters, two cards and one package.

Sgt. De Angelis, a former Bethlehem Steel employe, was inducted in October, 1941. He was stationed for 23 months in Newfoundland with the Coast Artillery. In November, 1943, he was transferred to the infantry and was shipped overseas, where he has served in England, France, Germany and Luxembourg. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank De Angelis, live at 1014 East Third Street. A brother, Ernest De Angelis, age 18, graduated from Liberty High School last February and is now in Navy training at Sampson, N. Y.
