Local Board No. 2 Sends Another Group To Service

Twenty-five candidates from Bethlehem City Board No. 2 are among the 56 selectees for U. S. army service Saturday at the Allentown Induction Center. The remaining 31 were chosen from Schuylkill County Board No. 7, with headquarters at Pottsville.

Three of the Bethlehem men were taken for training as aviation cadets. They are Paul J. Beezer, Robert K. Bieber and Harry J. Buchecker. The only one of the acceptees to go directly to camp was Samuel Rich of the Schuylkill County board.
