He is a member of an ordnance unit attached to an aviation air base. Sgt. Vanic was married to Florence Chickey, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Chickey, 1015 East Fourth Street, on May 10, 1941 just a few days before his induction. He is a graduate of Bethlehem High School, class of '36 and was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company before going into the service.
