ENSIGN MOSES 'VISITS' FATHER IN HOSPI

Telephone Unites Briefly Naval Officer and Moravian Clergyman in Hospital.

A slender strand of copper wire spanning thousands of miles of land spanning thousands of miles of land and water, the nimble fingers of uncounted telephone operators and the desire to ask, "How are you, father?" brought together one of Bethlehem's best-loved clergymen and his son, an ensign in Uncle Sam's Navy on duty in the far Pacific.

Inc. United by this tenuous thread late Wednesday afternoon were W. Vivian Moses, D. D., convalescing in St. Luke's Hospital from a recent surgical operation, and Ensign Viv-ian H. Moses. Informed several ian H. Moses. Informed several weeks ago of his father's operation. Ensign Moses took up the receiver "somewhere in the Pacific" and in the space of three hours, more or less, was conversing with his father in Bethlehem. Word was received at the hospital at about 1:30 p. m. that a long distance message was on the way and at 4:30 the call came through. "You can imagine how thrilled I was when taking up the receiver

"You can imagine how thrilled I was when, taking up the receiver near my cot, I heard plainly the voice of my son, Vivian," said Dr. Moses today as he happily recount-ed the incident. "Vivian asked about my condition and especially cautioned me not to go to work too soon. He stated that he is quite well."

Dr. Moses said that he and Mrs. Moses had not heard from their son for over a year. He was at Pearl Harbor when the Japs made their

Harbor when the Japs made their infamous attack on December 7, a year ago, but escaped injury. Ensign Moses was graduated from the Moravian Preparatory School and Lafayette College, from the latter in 1939. He enlisted in October, 1940, and went on a school training ship at first. He spent three months in intensive training at the Northwest University, where he was commisioned an ensign. He spent the next ten days at home with his parents. Afterward he went to California and was trans-fered thence to the Pacific theater. Ensign Moses is a members of the Phi Beta Kappa fraternity. Dr. Moses, the father, came to

The latter is the president of the Provincial Elders' Conference of the Moravian Church, North Province, North America and Canada. Dr. Moses is also dean of the Seminary de-partment of the women's institu-tion tion.
