In his last year he was selected on the All-Sea Services Team. Played football for four years at the University of Richmond, graduating in 1961. He was co-captain of the Spiders in his Senior year and was All-Southern Conference tackle the same year. Was named to the Academic All-American Football Team. Line coach at Fork Union Military Academy, Fork Union, Virginia, (1961-1965).

Note: Coach Buffman, while at F.U.M.A. enjoyed the status as co-coach, and comes to Liberty High with a 34-8-1 Record. During this period, Fork Union won the League Championship 3 years.

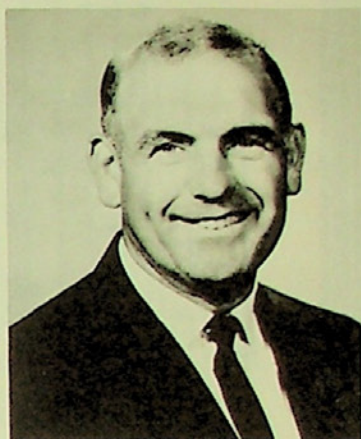

Junior Varsity Backfield Coach and Baseball Coach

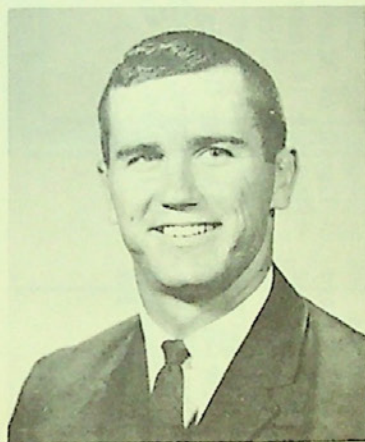

Against five common foes (Pennsbury, Neshaminy, Phillipsburg, Dieruff and Easton), Allen shows a 3-1-1 record compared to 0-5 for Liberty.

Critics Proven Wrong

When the home-and-home arrangement between the schools was inaugurated in 1963, critics were quick to say that the lustre of the traditional Thanksgiving Day scrap would be marred by a lopsided score in the initial meeting. However, nothing could be further from the truth.

Actually, on the basis of past results in the experiment, a good bet would be that today's game winds up in a stalemate. In the seven games played starting in 1963, each team has two wins while there have been three ties, one each in 1963-64-65.

However, Liberty's two victories both have been in the first and unofficial game which doesn't count in either Big Six Conference play nor Lehigh Valley Big Five action. The Hurricanes' last Thanksgiving Day victory was in 1960 when the locals prevailed, 19-0. Since 1936 the Canaries enjoy a 17-5-5 lead in the Turkey Day classics.

Overall, William Allen dominates the series which dates back to 1920 with a 23-17-7 record.

Good luck players, farewell seniors and may the best team win.

This is it. The big one. The end of the line. No one will be saving anything for next week. Both coaches, Liberty's Bob Buffman and William Allen's George (Fritz) Halfacre, will be pulling out all stops today in the 48th meeting of the Hurricanes and the Canaries.

A repeat of the first contest between the schools this season when Liberty earned a hard-fought 21-20 decision would be a fan's delight. Those who witnessed the game at Allentown were indeed lucky as many oldtimers rate it as one of the best gridiron battles seen in many a year.

And there's no reason not to expect the same this afternoon. A win for Allen (6-2-1) would represent the best campaign since 1959 when the Canaries were 8-2. Similarly, a victory for Liberty (4-5) would give the Hurricanes the most wins in a season since 1957 when they were 6-3.

Despite Liberty's win earlier this season the visitors today will be cast in the favorite role due to their performance against common rivals this year.

ATHLETIC PROGRAM OF LIBERTY HIGH SCHOOL

The athletic program of Bethlehem High School, extensive in scope and based on sound principles of administration, seeks to meet the physical, emotional, and recreational needs of adolescents. Through well-planned activities—inter-scholastic and intra-mural—under the direction of a competent staff excellent opportunities are provided for participation by a large segment of the school population. Experiences are offered which stimulate the development of motor skills and also promote good physical and mental health.

Athletic policies are developed by an Athletic Council, comprising the Superintendent of Schools, High School Principal, Director of Athletics and three to five members of the Board of Education. The Council's decisions are recommended to the Board of Education for their approval.

The program, despite its extensiveness is largely self-sustaining, through revenue derived from football and basketball. All costs associated with the sponsoring ten (10) interscholastic sports are defrayed through revenue secured from public support of these activities. The stadium, the debt of which was amortized annually, was completely paid for in the Spring of 1953. The major portion of the sports program of the four junior high schools is also financed.

Outdoor activities are conducted in an area of approximately ten acres—an area immediately adjacent to the school plant and one which insures one of the most modern programs of physical education activities. The huge stadium, immediately to the rear of the Memorial Gymnasium was constructed in 1938 and is capable of seating 16,588 persons. The modern Memorial Gymnasium, erected in 1955 and having a seating capacity for four thousand (4,000) persons, offers excellent facilities for physical education and athletics particularly basketball and wrestling. Additional land area offers facilities for tennis, soccer, baseball, softball, track, archery, and hockey.

The entire athletic program seeks to meet the present and probable future health needs of growing boys and girls. Bethlehem prides itself on the excellent quality of sportsmanship which prevails, and conscientious efforts are constantly expended to insure courteous treatment of opponents by participants and spectators alike. Further, Bethlehem's representatives have gone on to greater triumphs in collegiate circles and quite a number have graced the rolls of All-American selections.

Bethlehem High School is dedicated to the task of continuing to offer the finest physical education activities necessary to insure physical, mental, and emotional fitness and to evaluate these activities in terms of the objectives of the entire school program.
