Capt. Keating Home On Terminal Leave

Capt. Joseph F. Keating, veteran of the drive through France and Germany with the 75th Infantry Division, is home on terminal leave from the Indiantown Gap Military Reservation.

Capt. Keating graduated from Lehigh University and entered the Army as a buck private in April, 1942. He was sent to Camp Wheeler, Ga. to receive his basic training, later serving in headquarters there before being assigned to O. C. S. at Fort Benning, Ga. In the Summer of 1943 he graduated as a second lieutenant and served in the Infantry Replacement Training Center at Fort McClellan, Ala.; personnel officer at Camp Blanding, Fla., and Camp Breckenridge, Ky. before going overseas with the 75th.

In addition to the European Theatre ribbon with three battle stars, Keating wears the Combat Infantry Badge and Purple Heart, awarded to him for wounds received last winter in the Battle of the Bulge.

The son of Mrs. and the late Miles Keating, 416 Carlton Ave., he is a graduate of Bethlehem Catholic High School. His discharge will become effective about April 3.
