Mrs. Julia Csrenko, 744 Laufer Avenue, was informed in a telegram from the War Department Thursday that her son, Pfc. Charles Csrenko, had been wounded in action and had been removed to a hospital for medical treatment. Pfc. Csrenko enlisted in the Marine Corps August 3, two years ago. Since then he has seen action in the Marshall Islands and more recently on Saipan. Before enlisting he was employed by R. K. Laros.

In a letter, dated July 28, his brother M. M. 3-c Joseph Csrenko, wrote of having seen Charles for the first time in over 14 months, while sitting in a barroom in the South Pacific. He said the meeting was one of the happiest in his life. Joseph has been in the South Pacific since April and had been employed in the No. 6 Machine Shop in the Bethlehem Steel before enlisting. He is well-known at the Boys Club where he was a weight-lifter.
