In the Pacific, Commander Shultz

was attached first to the staff of Admiral Halsey, and later to the staff of Admiral Nimitz, who then had his headquarters at Pearl Harbor. The commander was in charge of special services to personnel.

Commander Shultz, his leave ended, will report to Admiral Ingersoll, commander of the western sea front, in San Francisco. The commander has been in the service since May 1942. The Shultzs then lived at 631 First Avenue.
