Lieutenant McCann, who was stationed at Camp Campbell, Ky, was an officer in tactical coordination and observation from the air.

Enlisting in the Army in February, 1941, the youth took a preflight training course at the officer candidate school, Miami Beach, Fla, He graduated from there in August, 1942, and was then transferred to Brooks Field, Tex., where he attended the air force observation school and received his wings and commission in October, 1942.

Following graduation from Easton High School in 1936, he attended the State Teachers College at East Stroudsburg for two years prior to entering the service.

Surviving are the parents, three sisters, Mrs. Mitchell LaBar of Stroudsburg, Mrs. Irene Hershaw of Long Island and Mrs. Frederick Searles of Pinllipsburg R. D., and a brother, Carl McCann of Easton. Lieutenant McCann was a member of St. Bernard's Catholic Church.
