Although it was inaugurated only a year ago, the U. S. Marine Corps Women Reserve has freed 18,600 men for battle service. Of these women, 26 come from the Lehigh Valley. There are many positions in this service, 125 different types, at more than 50 Marine Corps posts and stations.
