Bethlehem Paratrooper Dies In Action in Sicily Campaign

Mr. and Mrs. John Vidumsky, 328 Hillside Avenue, were yesterday apprised by the War Department that their son, Private First Class Stephen William Vidumsky, aged 26, a paratrooper, had been killed in action July 11 in the Sicilian campaign. Adjutant General Ulio advised the parents that a detailed letter is to follow.

Private Vidumsky entered the service April 23, 1942, and received his training in stages at Fort Meade, Camp Wheeler, Ft. Benning and Fort Bragg, arriving in the North African theatre April 21, of this year.

The soldier had been an employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company at the time of his entry to service. He was a graduate of SS. Cyril and Methodius Parochial School and attended Bethlehem Tech.

He is survived by his parents and these sisters and brothers: Mrs. John Ritter and Mrs. Manuel Rodriguez, of Bethlehem; Helen, John and Michael Vidumsky, at home; and Sister Elizabeth Marie, of the Order
