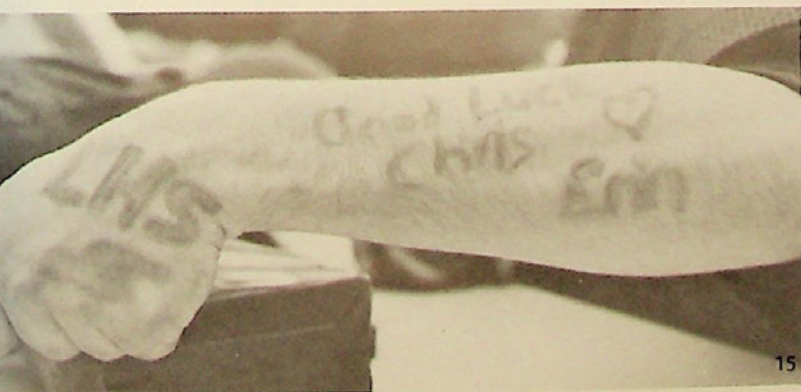

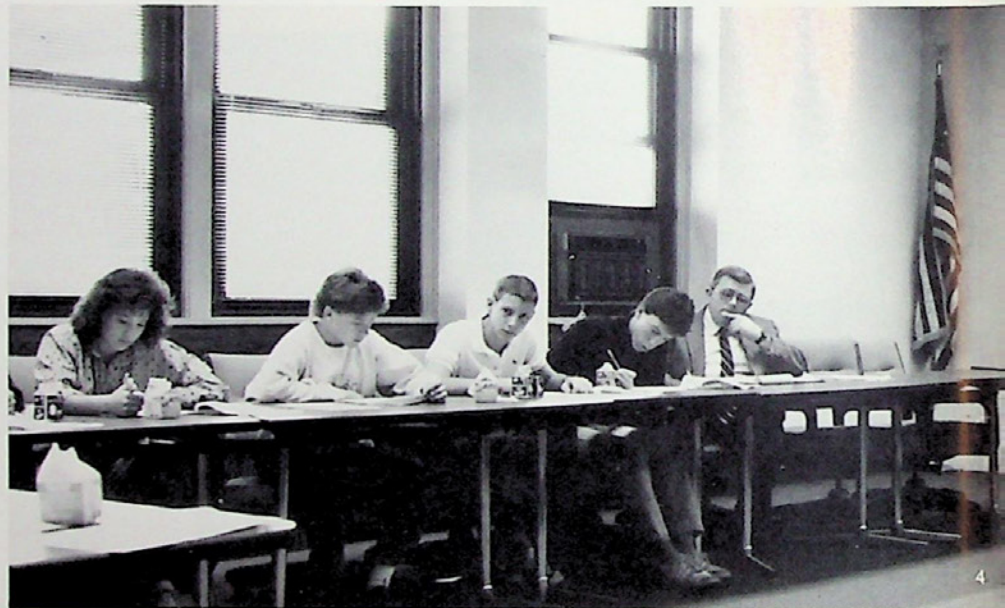

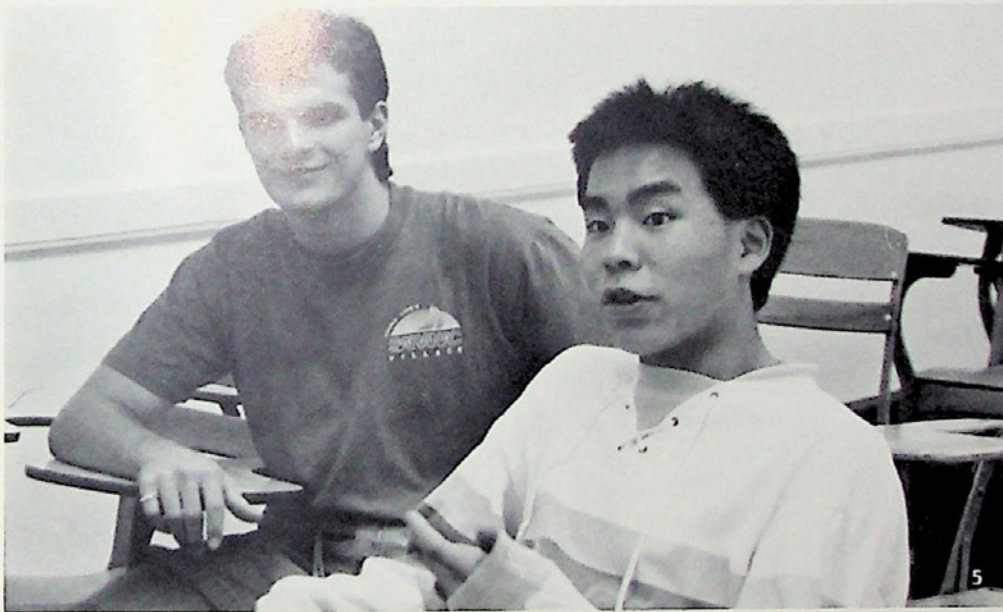
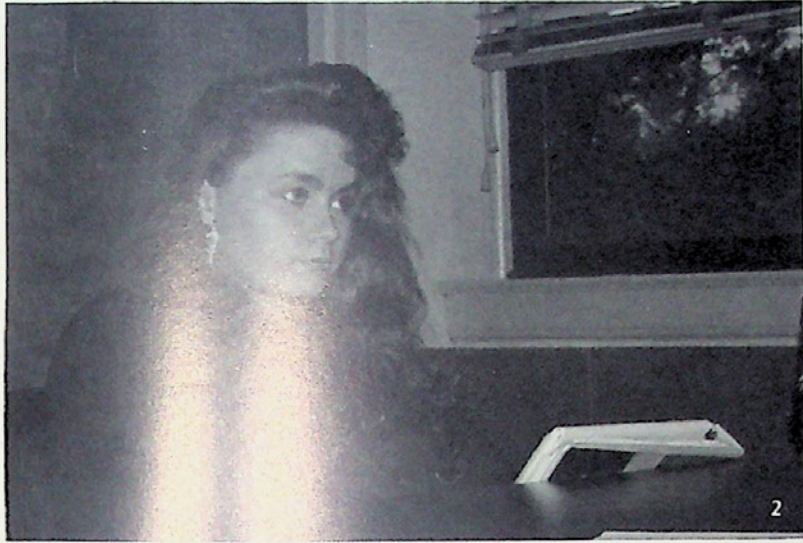


Representatives Establish Communication

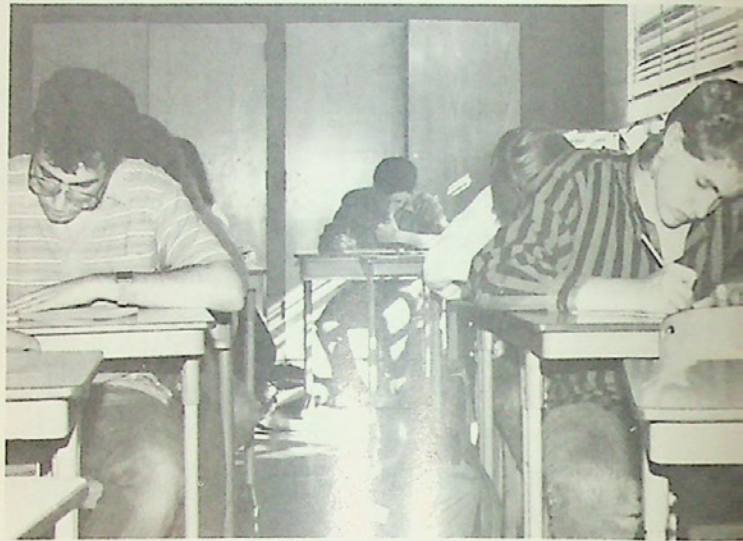

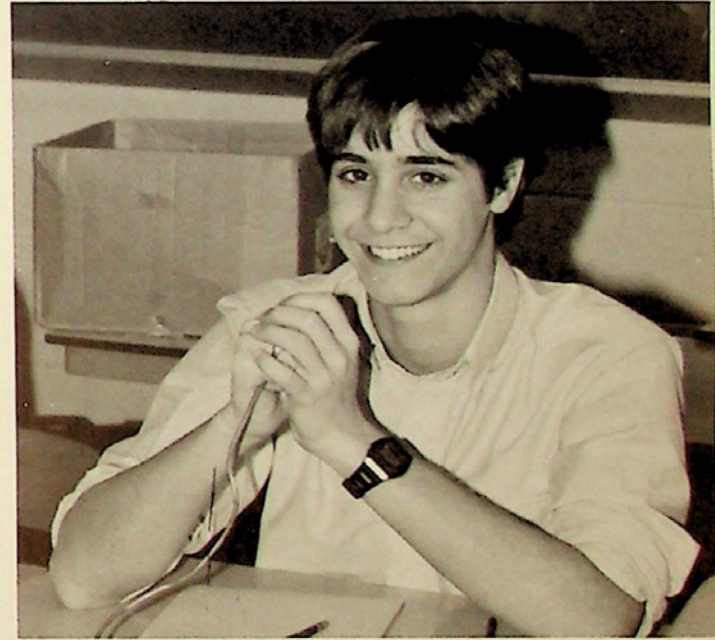
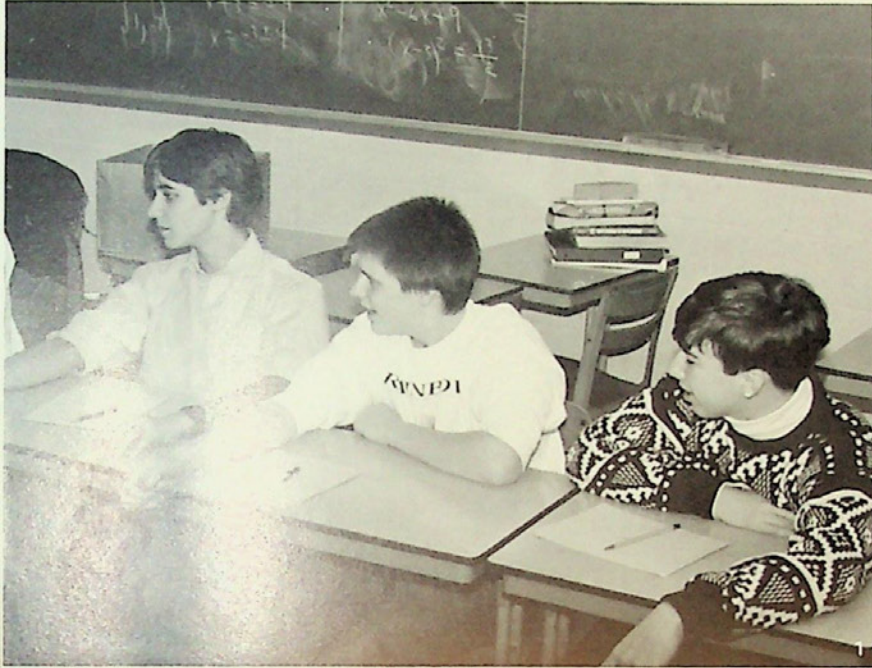

Academic Achievement

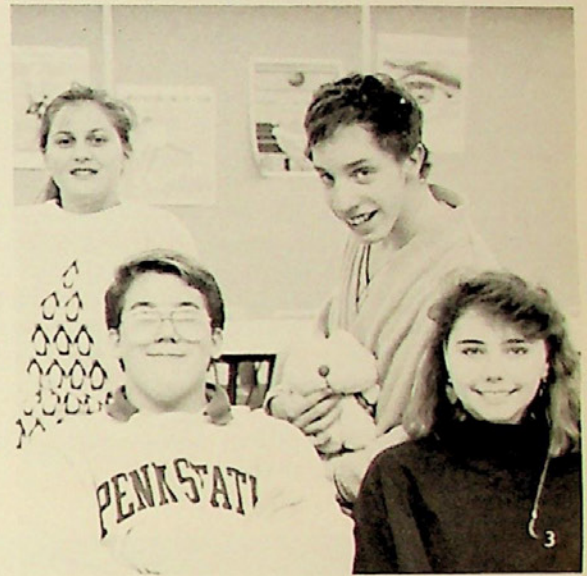

Library Gains An Assist

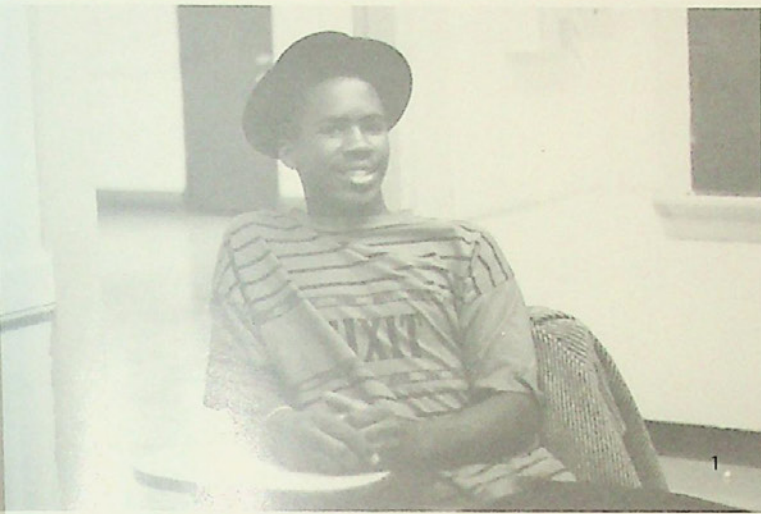

Artists Channel Creativity

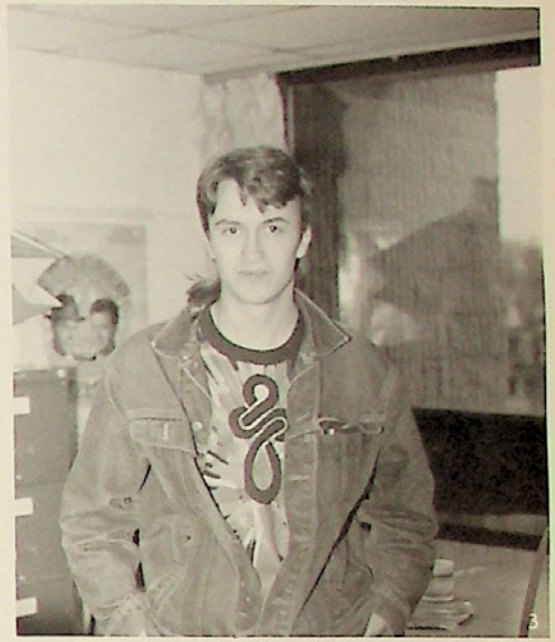

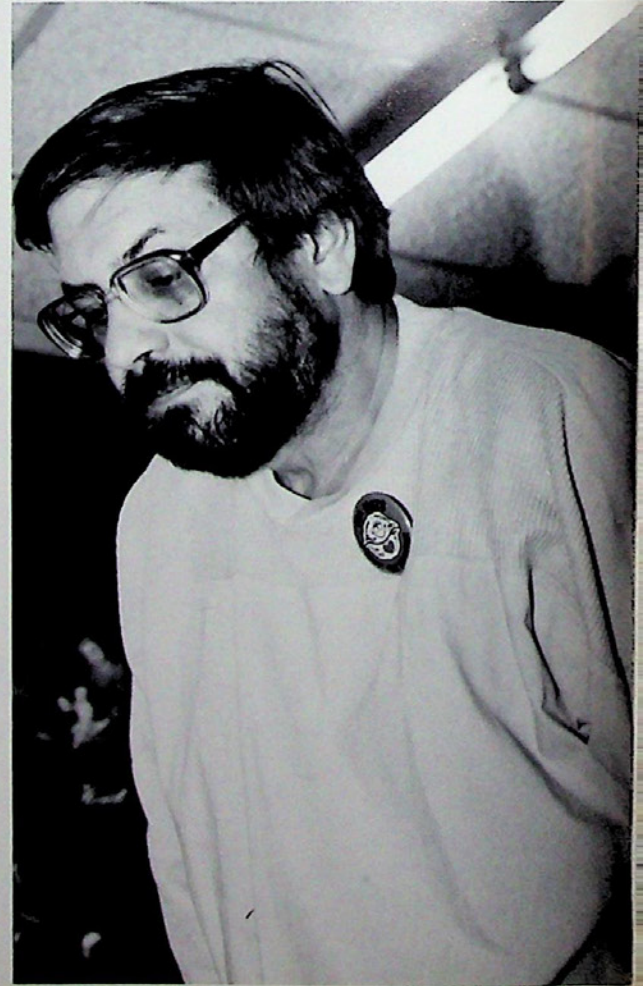

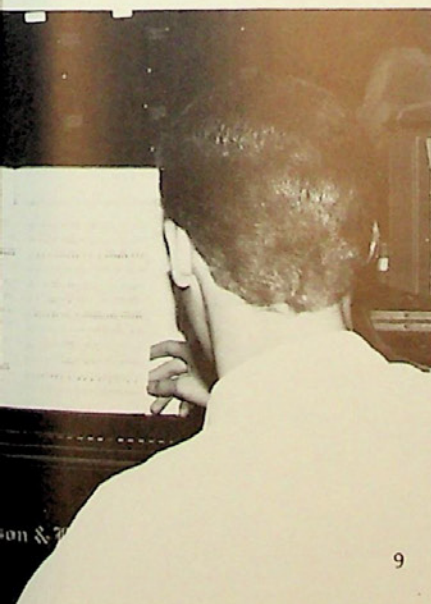

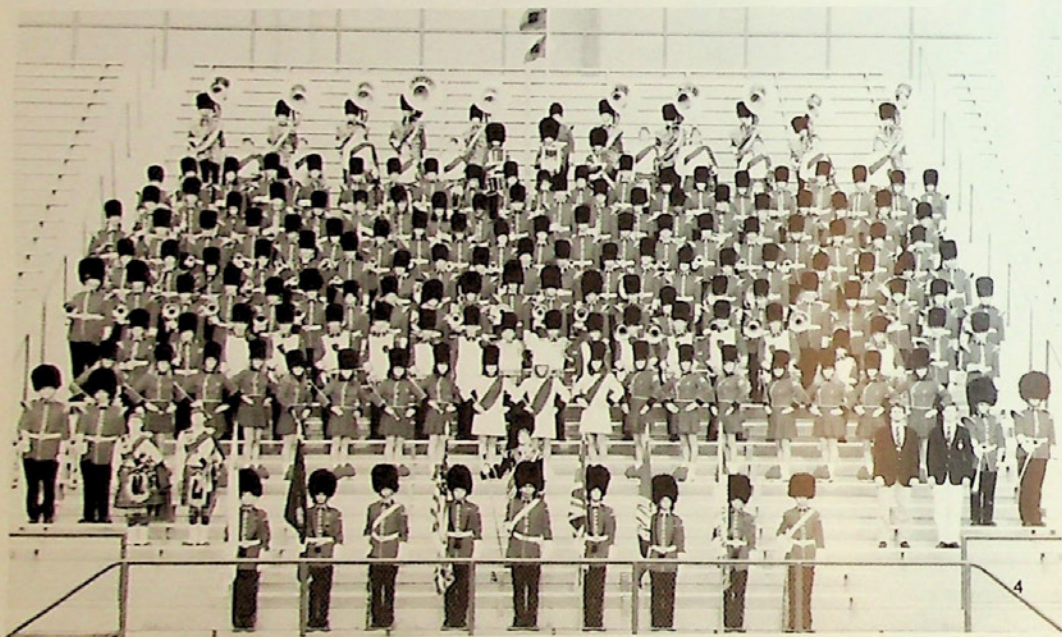

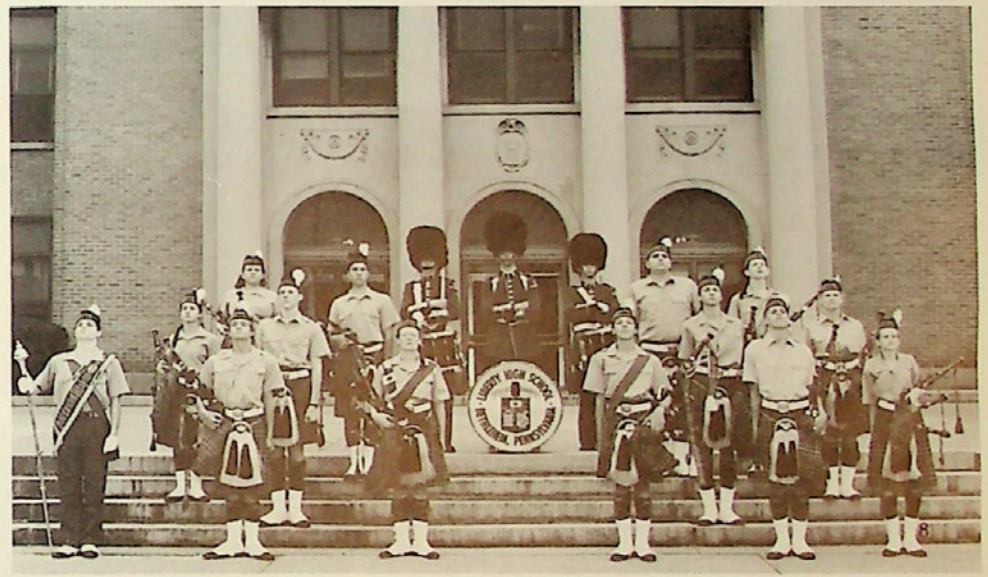
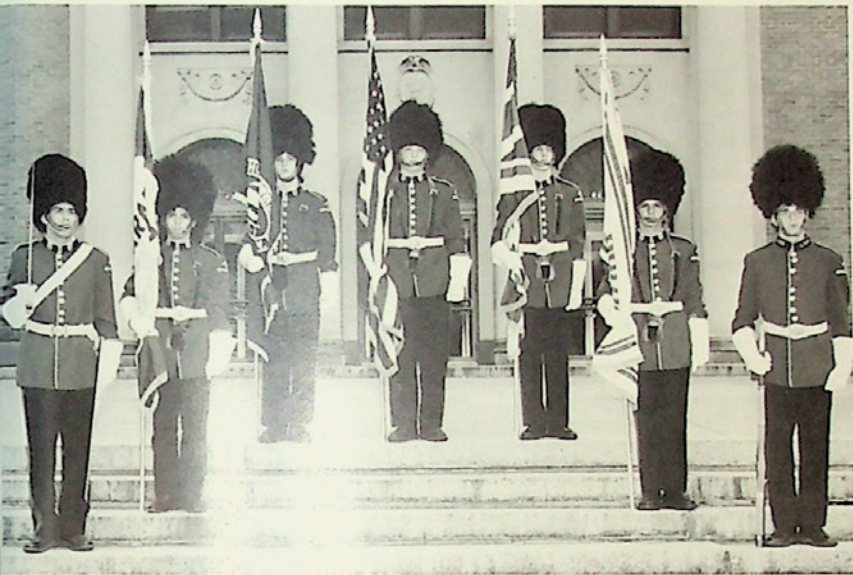
The 1989-90 Liberty High School Grenadier Band Auxillary Units were a major facet to this year's band.

Orchestra Shines At Various Concerts

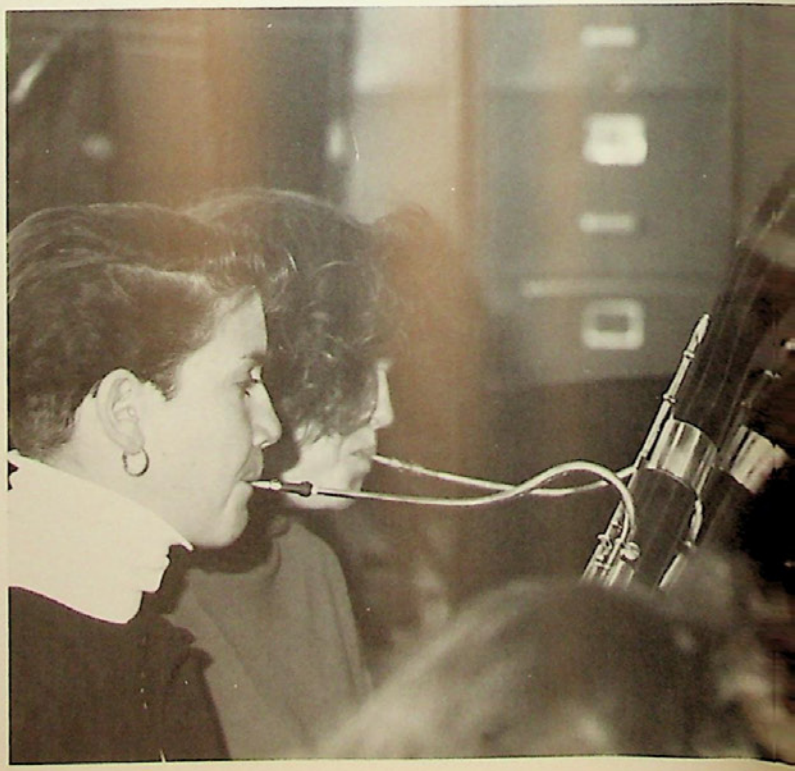
Once again the Liberty High School Orchestra had a successful year. This ensemble of approximately eighty students provides an opportunity to pursue music in a symphonic orchestra setting.

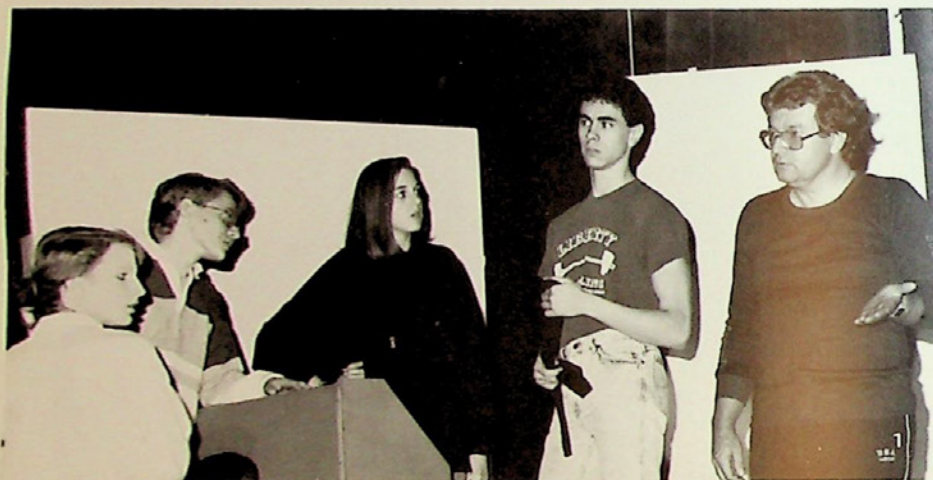

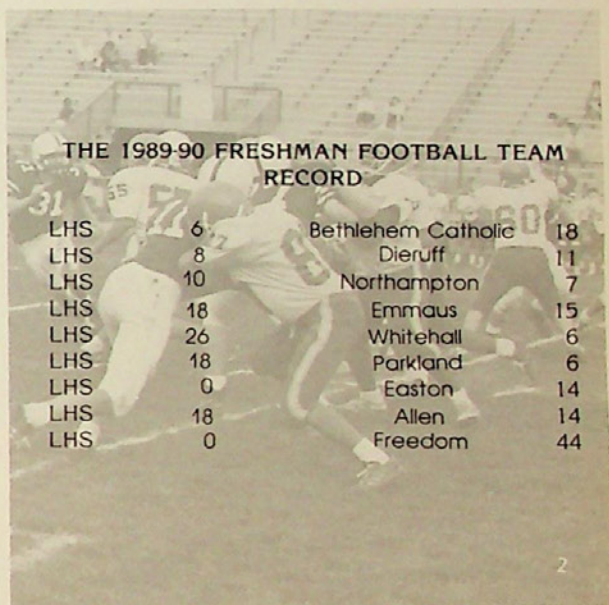

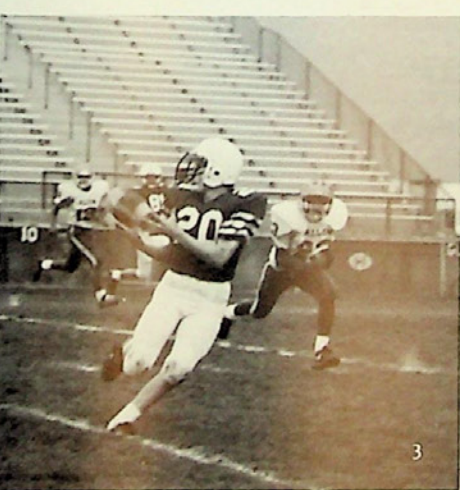
Frosh Develop Strength

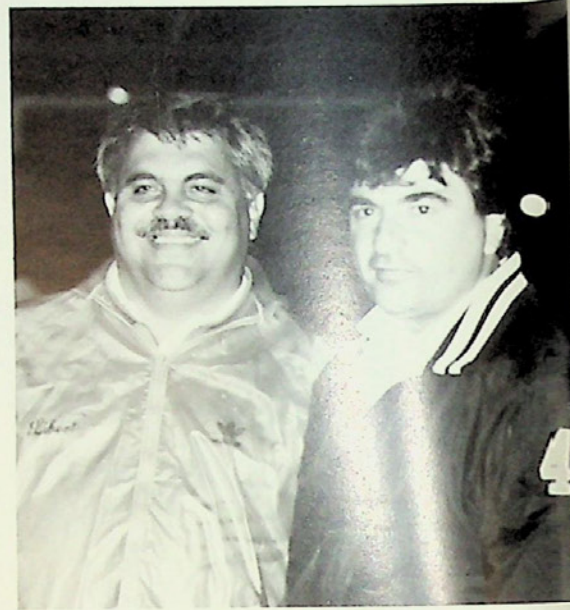

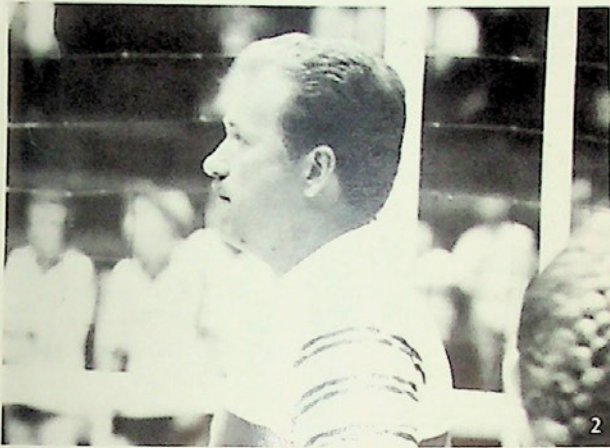

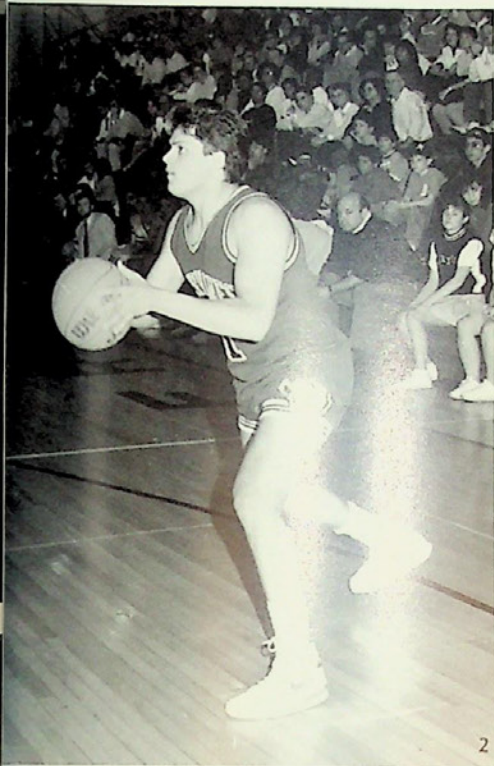
Basketball Players Take Flight

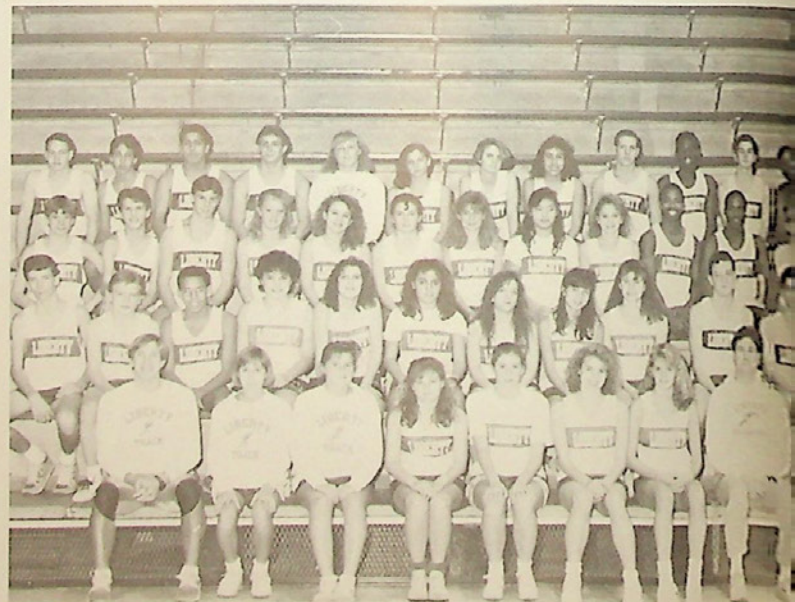
Track Continued Through Winter Season

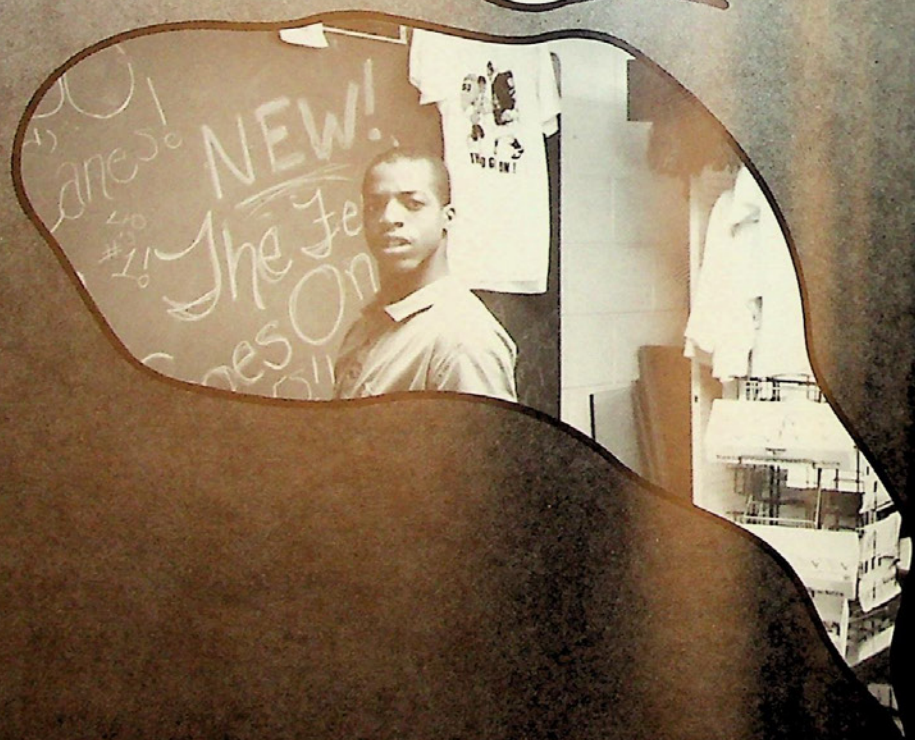

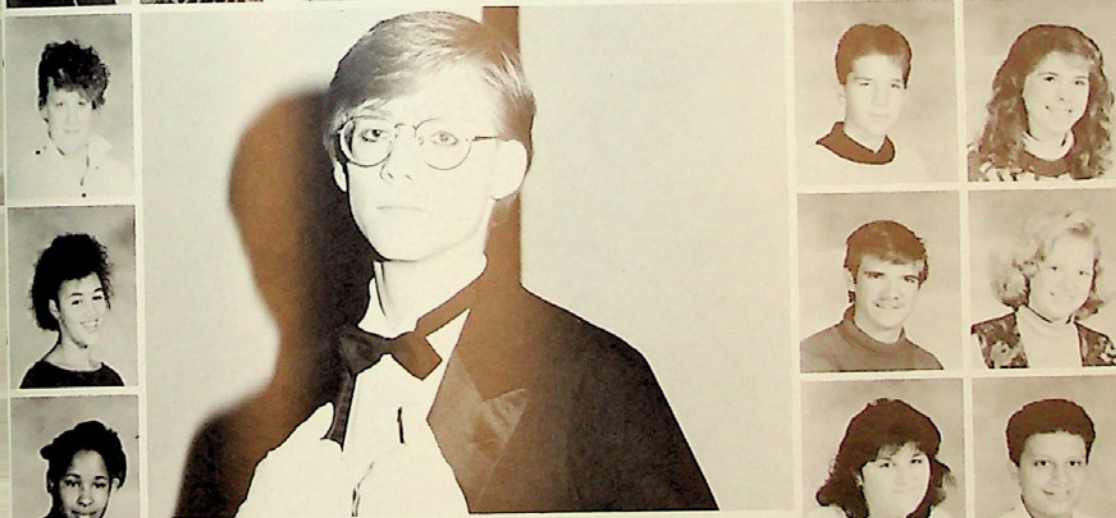

Sophomores

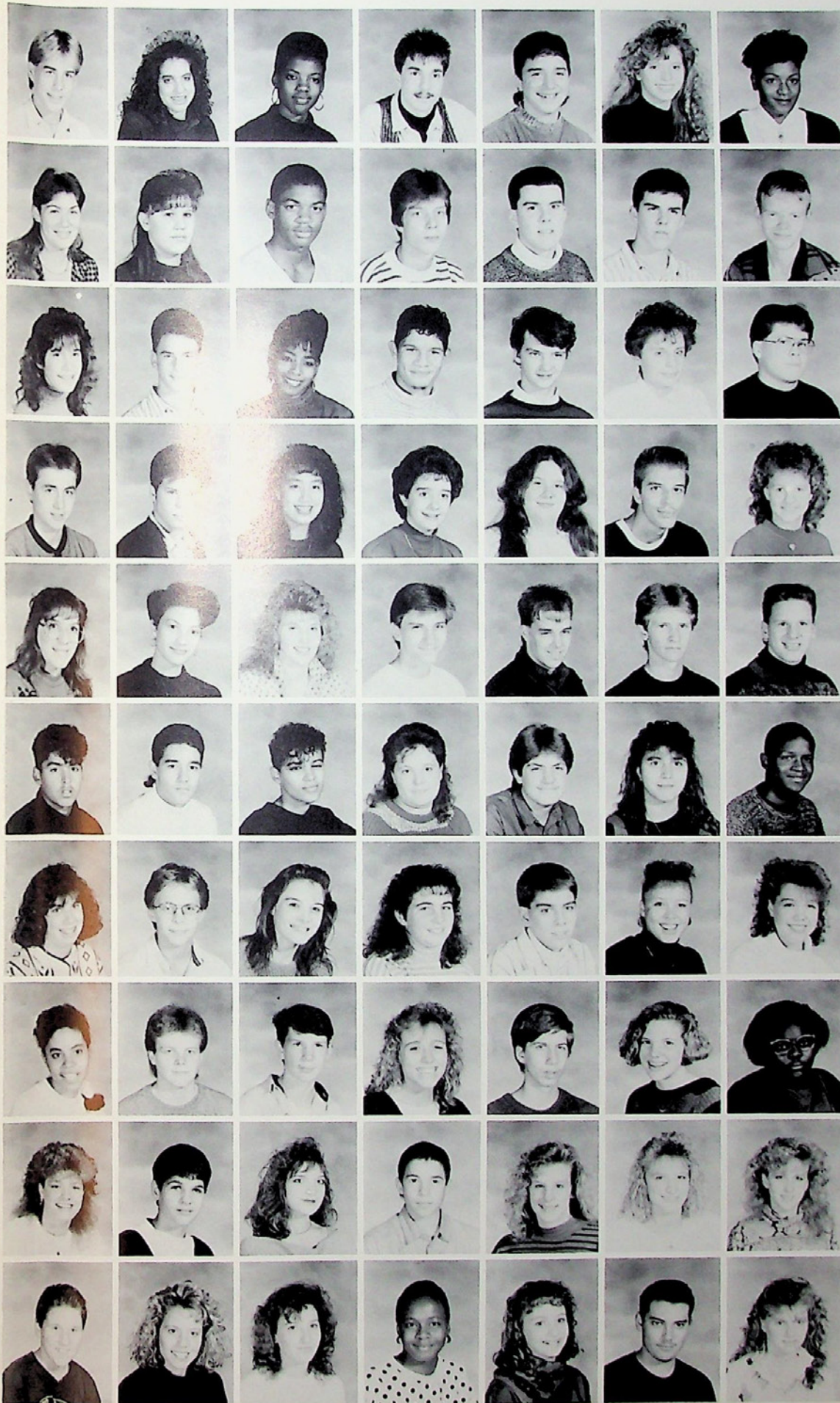

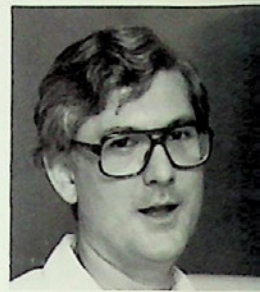


Student Services

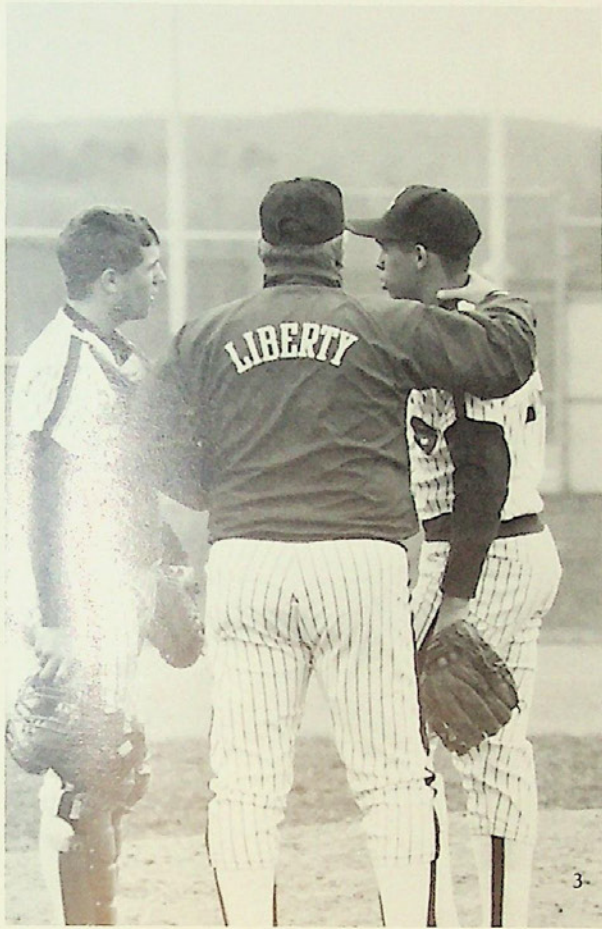
The JV Baseball Team completed their season with an even 10-wins and 10-losses. Certainly with another year of hard practice the team can develop into a strong Varsity team.

L.H.S. Girls Softball

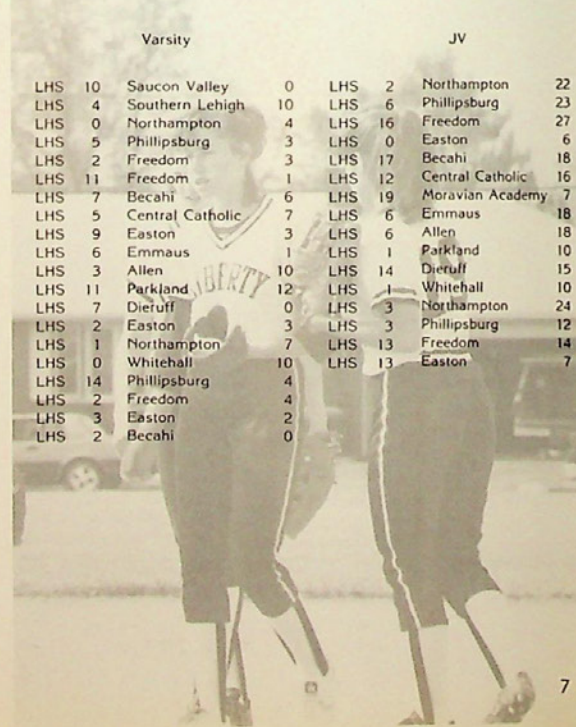

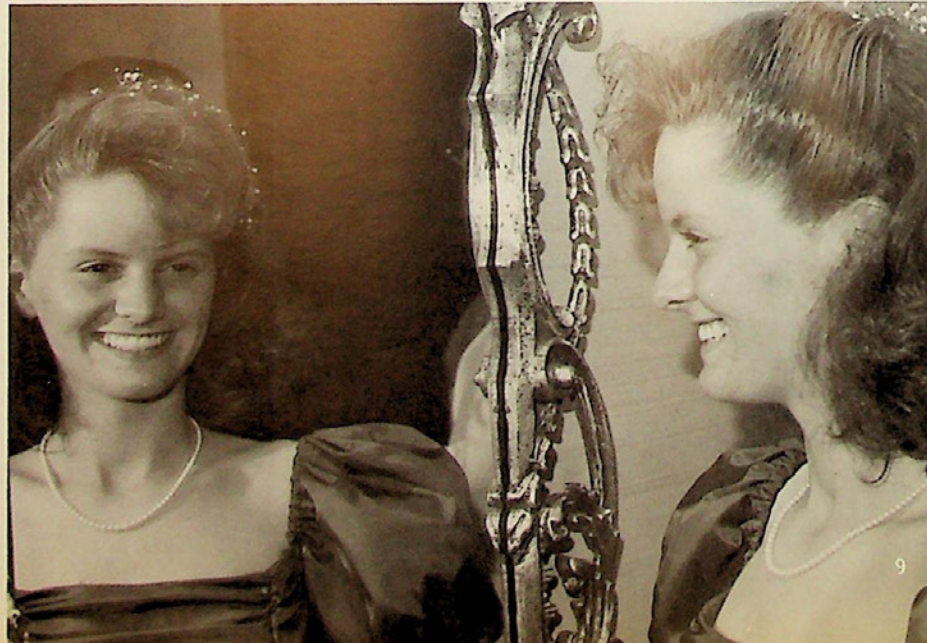
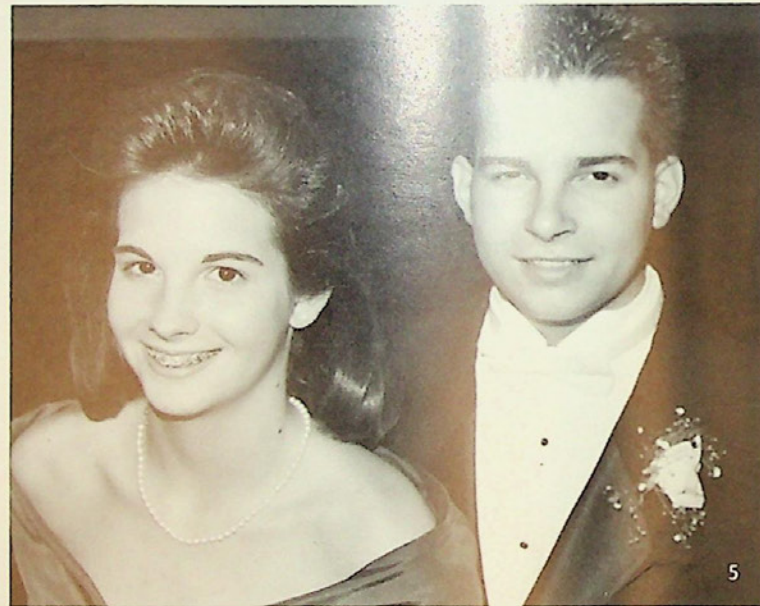
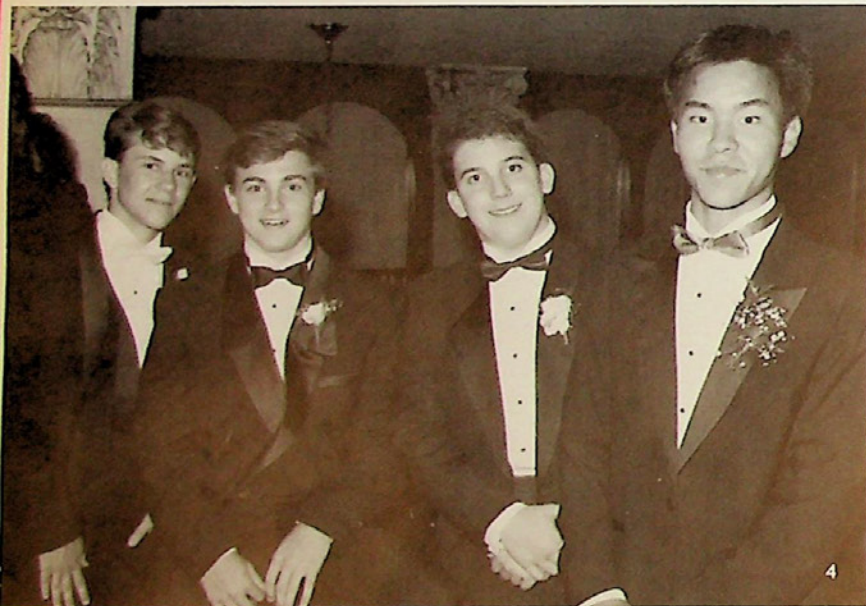
Make It Last Forever

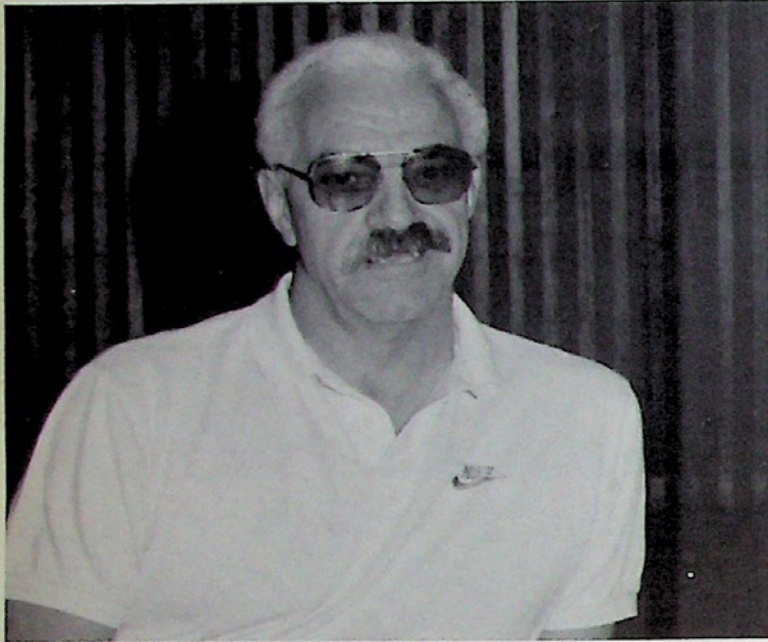

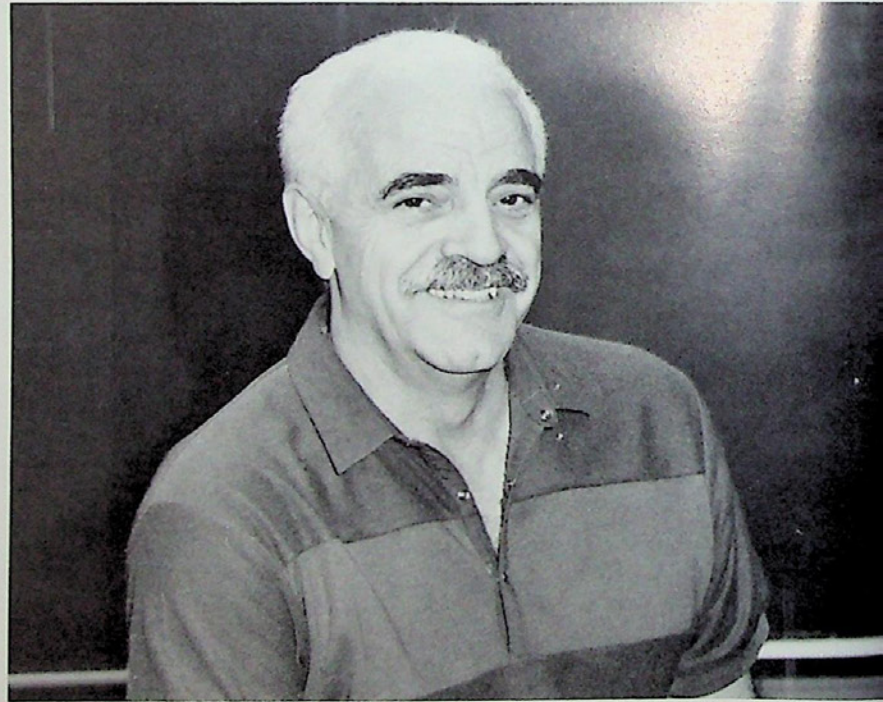
