**S/Sgt. Earl W. Ott
Home From Europe
After Being Wounded**

S/Sgt. Earl W. Ott, son of Mr. and Mrs. M. Ott, Raubsville, and husband of the former Anita Brown, 709 Itaska Street, is spending a 60-day furlough visiting his parents and wife, and year-old son, Dale, whom he last saw at one and one-half weeks of age.

S/Sgt. Ott was seriously wounded in Germany, February 25, 1945, and is a convalescent at the Walter Reed Hospital, Washington, D. C. A member of the 84th Railsplitter Infantry Division, he saw action in France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. He wears the Good Conduct Medal, Purple Heart, Combat Infantry Badge, and the European Theater Ribbon with two battle stars, for participating in the battles of Ardennes and Rhineland.
