Local Marine Honor Guard At FDR Rites 1945

The Marine guards were at the White House on Saturday when the body of the late chief executive was brought to the capital, and preceded the funeral train to Hyde Park for the burial exercises yesterday morning.

Pfc. Gallagher is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert E. Gallagher, Sr. Prior to entering the service De¹ cember 8, 1941, he was employed in No. 4 shop office, Bethlehem Steel Company. He attended Pennsylvania Military College in 1938 and West Point in 1939.
