**Sgt. Albert Johnson
Given Army Release**

Sgt. Albert Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Johnson, 42 West Laurel St., was honorably discharged at Indiantown Gap Military Reservation after having served more than three years with the U. S. armed forces.

Sgt. Johnson enlisted Dec. 8, 1942, and was sent to Miami Beach, Fla., where he received his basic training. He took pre-cadet training at Kent University in Ohio and was later reclassified at San Antonio, Tex., and sent to gunnery school in Laredo, Tex. Assigned to a B-24 at Salt Lake City, Sgt. Johnson continued his varied Army career at Biggs Field, Tex., where he was grounded because of his health. He was assigned to the armament section in Topeka, Kan., serving there for the remainder of his "hitch."

The ex-sarge is a former Cornell University student and a graduate of Liberty High School. His brother, T/Sgt. Charles Johnson, expects to be released from duty at Fort Meade, Md., this week.
