In Liberty's School 2 Work program, students who have learned English as a second language are given the opportunity to discover career opportunities at St. Luke's Hospital. 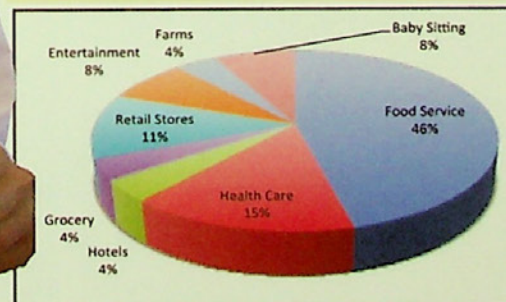


Hands-On Learning

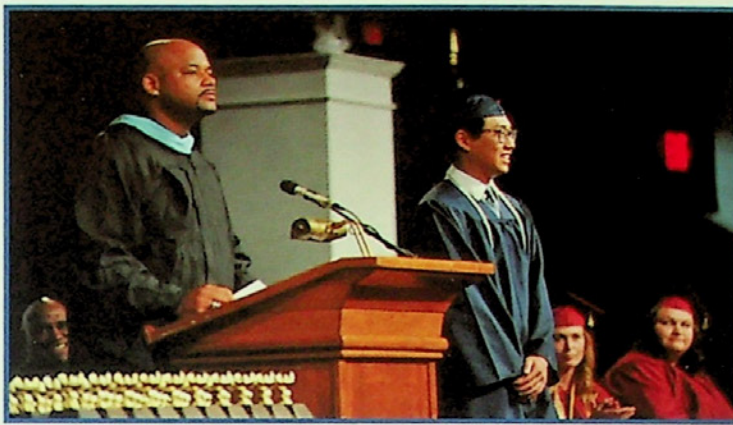
Hail To Thee!

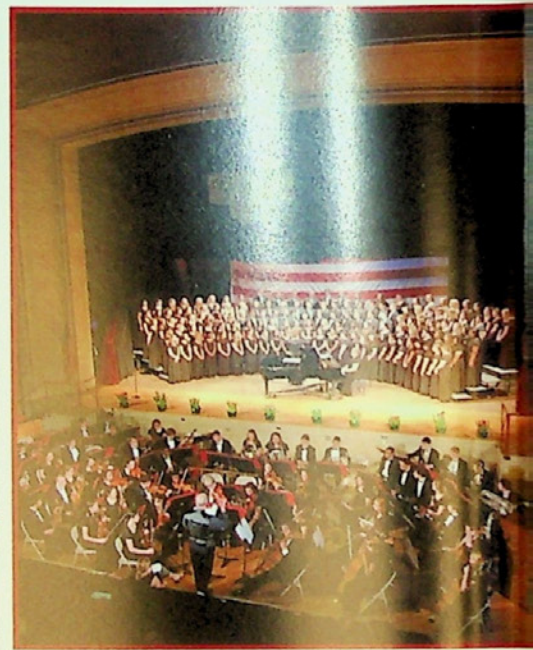


Tuning Up

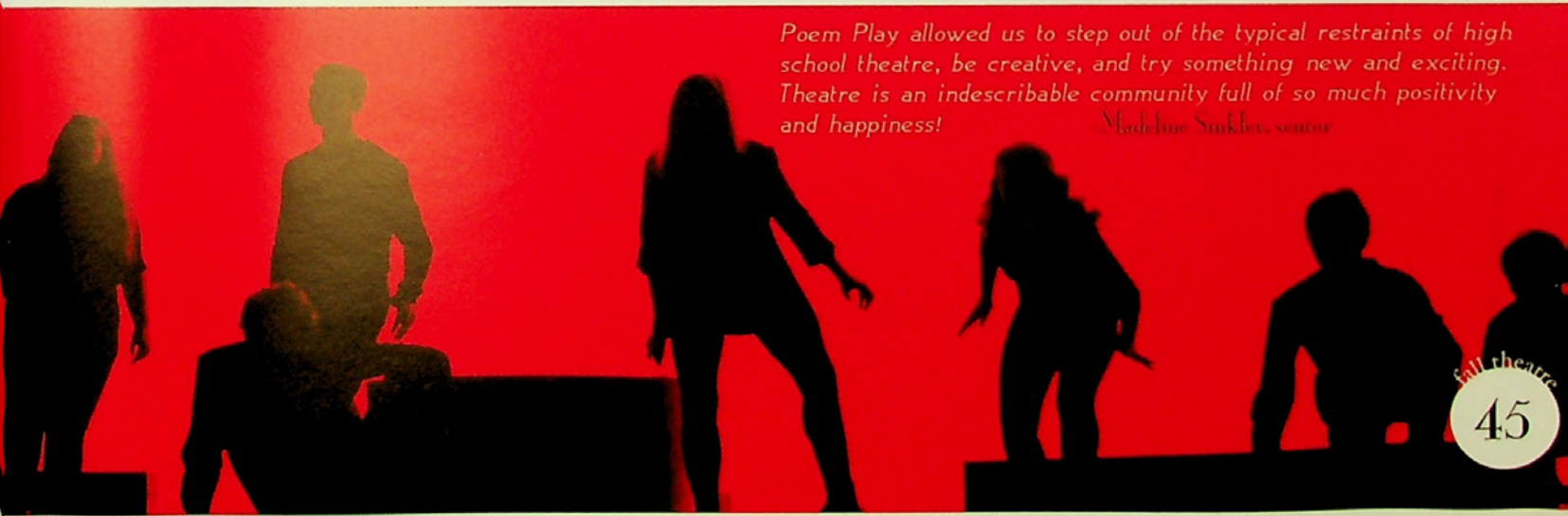

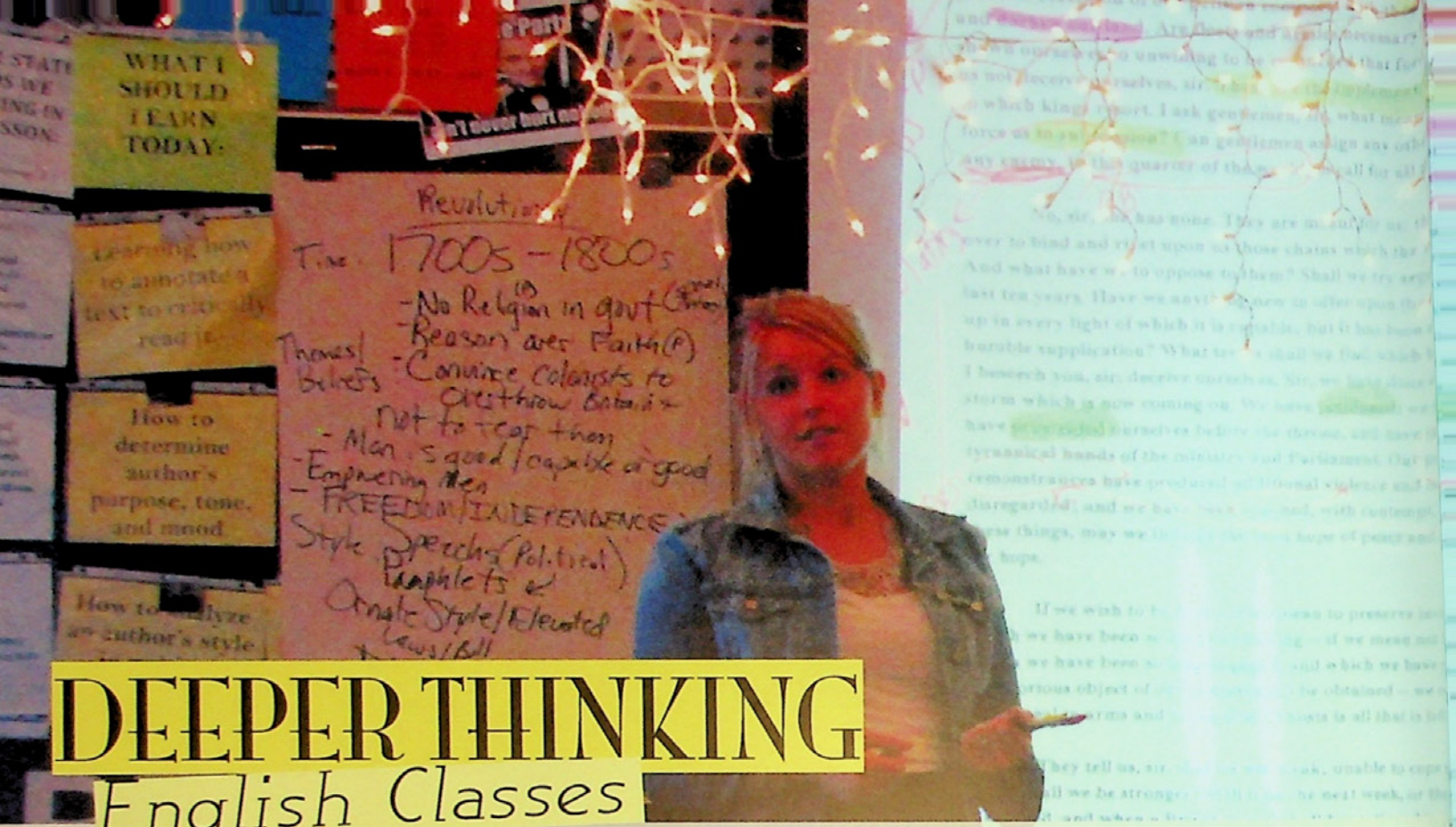
A Way of Self-Expression

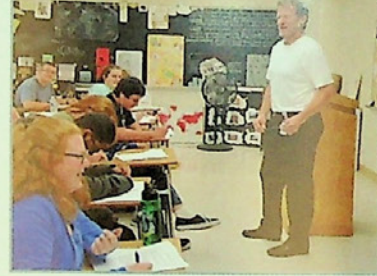


SKEPTICISM & LOGIC

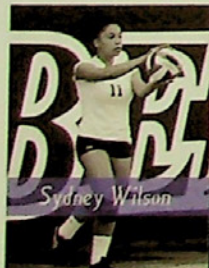


FIGHT for the WIN

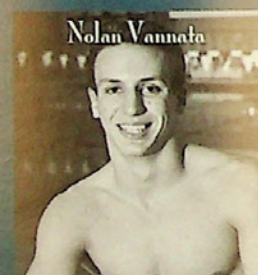
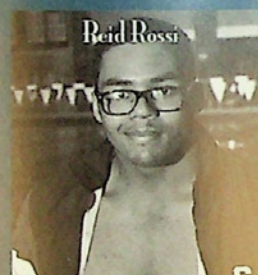
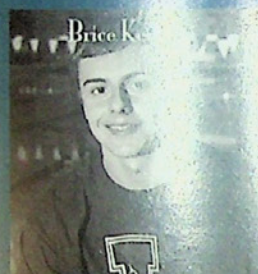
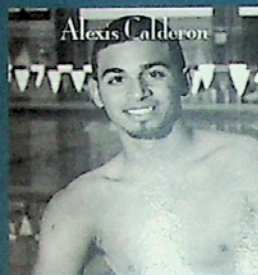
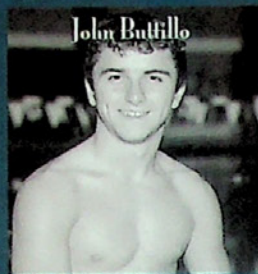
RACING against the CLOCK

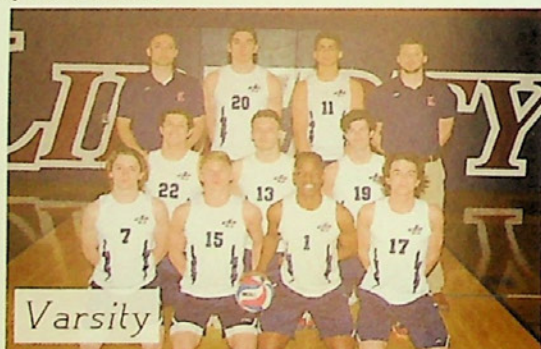
FIGHTING for the WIN

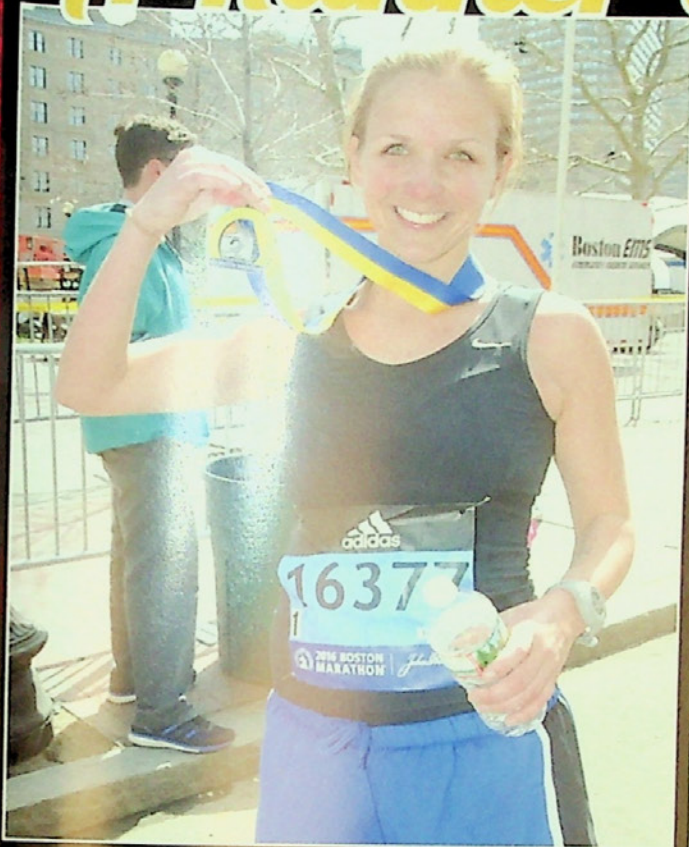


Bringing History to Life

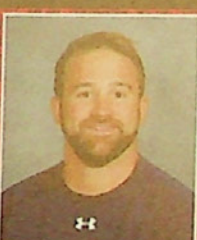


A Runner's World
