CARMELITE NUNS
TO BE PROFESSED

Ceremony Sunday Afternoon in Shrine at Lanark.

The Little Flower Shrine-Chapel of the Carmelite Nuns at Lanark Manor, near Allentown, will be the scene of an impressive ceremony of religious profession, when four cloistered nuns will pronounce their holy vows on Sunday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock. The Rt. Rev. Monsignor Leo G. Fink, V. F., rector of Sacred Heart Church, Allentown, will preside at the special services and will be assisted by the Very Rev. Anthony J. Dressel, Ord. Carm. chaplain of the monastery. Rev. Dressel will likewise deliver the sermon.

Among the nuns to take solemn vows are Sister Stephanie of the Child Jesus, formerly Miss Sophie Krizin, sister to the Rev. Stephen Krizin, of Bethlehem, who is now Lieut. Chaplain in the U. S. Army.

Solemn benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament will be given by Monsignor Fink, celebrant; Monsignor Patrick F. McGee, pastor of St. Mary's Church, McSherrystown, deacon, and the Rev. Philip Bruckner, C. M., of St. Vincent's College, Germantown, sub-deacon.

On this occasion, Rev. Anthony Dressel will also conduct the meeting for the members of the Third Order Secular of Mount Carmel and will be assisted in the reception and profession of tertiaries by the Rev. Robert V. Lawrence.

The Liberty Bell Limited trolley car leaves the Allentown station every half hour and will stop at Lanark Manor where the Carmelite Monastery is located. The services will begin exactly at 3:30 p. m., on October 18.
