Ensign Evans Returns From Navy Sea Duty

NEW ORLEANS, La.—Ensign Cary G. Evans, USNR, of Bethlehem, Pa., has returned to the U. S. Naval Armed Guard Center at New Orleans after three months at sea as commander of the Navy gun crew on a merchant cargo ship plying Caribbean waters.

Ensign Evans was responsible for the defense of his ship in case of enemy attack.

The Armed Guard officer entered the Navy May 1, 1943. He attended indoctrination school at Cornell University, and Armed Guard Schools at Boston, Mass., and Gulfport, Miss.

He will now take the advanced training course at the Armed Guard Center, after which he will again be assigned as commander of the Navy gun crew on a merchant ship.

Evans was graduated in 1940 from Lehigh University, where he was a member of Phi Delta Theta fraternity, a member of the swimming and cross-country teams, and captain of the track team in his senior year.
