### S-Sgt. Earl Ott Seriously Wounded In German Action

Mrs. Earl W. Ott, the former Anita Brown, 709 Itaska Street, received a War Department telegram Wednesday evening informing her that her husband, Staff Sergeant Earl W. Ott, was seriously wounded in action in Germany, February 25.

Inducted November 28, 1942, he received infantry training at Camp Howze, Texas, and Camp Claiborne, La., before going overseas in October, 1944. Staff Sergeant Ott fought with the 84th Division in France, Belgium and Germany.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Monroe Ott, Robbinsville, Pa., he has three brothers also in the service: Corporal George Ott, in England; Private First Class Kenneth Ott, in Belgium, and Private Eli Ott, stationed at Camp Blanding, Fla. Mrs. Earl Ott and her son, 6-months-old David, reside at the Itaska Street address.
